FOUNDER

Jamia Hamdard was established by late Hakeem Abdul Hameed, a world-renowned practitioner of Unani Medicine of the 20th century who attracted people from around the world, including eminent personalities such as Prince Charles. Jamia Hamdard was the crystallization of his dream to make a significant contribution to the Indian Society. He had set his mind on raising the educational standard of the people, for he remembered the lines of the Holy Qur'an:

هَلْ يَسْتَوِي الَّذِينَ يَعْلَمُونَ وَالَّذِينَ لَا يَعْلَمُونَ .

سورة ٣٩- آية ٩

“Are those equal, those who know  
And those who do not know?”

(Qur'an - 39: 9)

By the time he died in 1999 at the age of 91, he had set-up 25 institutions, covering diverse fields from health and medicine to Islamic culture in India and its contribution to the Indian civilization. As a practicing Hakeem, it was his dream to develop Unani system of medicine on modern scientific lines. A great philanthropist, thinker and visionary that he was, Hakeem Abdul Hameed worked with unparalleled zeal to achieve his teachings of public charity, particularly in the areas of health and education, so that the educationally backward and psychologically demoralized Muslim minority could avail the benefits of modern education.




In 1962, he established the Institute of History of Medicine and Medical Research. In 1963, he set up the Indian Institute of Islamic Studies to promote the study of Islamic culture and civilization.

In 1962, Hamdard National Foundation was created to receive and disburse the profits earned by Hamdard (Wakf) Laboratories. The Foundation has taken up charitable causes in the areas of education, medical relief and the advancement of knowledge, consistent with the principles of the true teachings of Islam. Hamdard Tibbi College was set up in Gali Qasim Jaan, Old Delhi in 1963. It was later shifted to Jamia Hamdard Campus in 1980 to provide education in Unani Medicine to students so that the heritage of Unani Medicine largely available in Arabic and Persian languages is passed on to the students of future generations.

In 1972, Hamdard College of Pharmacy was set up to provide education and training in all branches of Pharmacy. Some of the other institutions established by him include Hamdard Education Society, Hamdard Study Circle, Hamdard Public School, Hamdard Institute of Historical Research, Ghalib Academy, Centre for South Asian Studies and Business & Employment Bureau. Later in 1989, many of these institutions were amalgamated into Jamia Hamdard which was given the status of Deemed to be University by UGC. Today, Jamia Hamdard excels in imparting high quality education.

All his efforts have been highly acknowledged in India as well as abroad. Many foreign visitors to Jamia Hamdard have observed that an institute of this magnitude can be conceived only by Governments and hardly by individuals. A delegation of Editors of Arabic newspapers observed that the greatest contribution of the Indian Muslims after Independence was the establishment of Jamia Hamdard & other educational institutions of Hamdard. Hakeem saheb was honoured with several national and international awards including the prestigious Avicenna Award presented by the erstwhile USSR in 1983. He was also conferred Padma Shri in 1965 and Padma Bhushan in 1991 by the Government of India, for his contributions in education, health and social service. He was an honorary member of the Academy of Medical Sciences of the Islamic Republic of Iran and Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh. In October 2000, the Research Centre for Islamic History, Art and Culture (IRCICA), Istanbul, Turkey, presented IRCICA Award for Patronage in Preservation of Cultural Heritage & Promotion of Scholarship to Hakeem saheb, posthumously.

Hakeem Abdul Hameed aimed at all-round growth and happiness to the society by providing opportunities for education and development of services and health care. It was his pioneering spirit that has always inspired Jamia Hamdard to successfully undertake multidimensional projects in the service of society.

**Chancellor**

Mr. Saiyid Hamid, Chancellor of Jamia Hamdard, is a renowned educationist and social activist. He is highly respected in the entire country, particularly in the Muslim Community for his initiative in Universalisation of education. He has made it a mission of his life by his writings, speeches and travels in various parts of the country. Drawing inspiration from his ideas, a number of educational institutions including schools and colleges have been set up in various parts of the country by philanthropists. After his retirement from Indian Administrative Service, which he served with distinction for 31 years, he was appointed as Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University. He served the University with distinction from 1980 to 1985 and restored sense of discipline and commitment in the University.

During his tenure, he also re-started the famous journal of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan, Tahzebul Akhlaq, which contains articles on issues of common interests to India's educationally backward Muslim Community.

After his retirement from Aligarh Muslim University, he was hand-picked by Hakeem Abdul Hameed for his educational mission. Hakeem saheb appointed him as Honorary Secretary of Hamdard Education Society as he conceived of a Deemed University in the Tughlaqabad Campus of Hamdard Institutions. He prepared all the proposals for declaration of Jamia Hamdard as a Deemed to be University. He also made a blueprint for the Hamdard Study Circle which is one of the country's most prestigious coaching institutions for civil services. So far, 161 candidates coached by this institution have been selected in the IAS & allied services.

He also conceived the idea of setting up of Hamdard Public School, which is a co-educational, CBSE affiliated school in the Talimabad Campus of Hamdard.

Mr. Saiyid Hamid is one of the country's most respected educationist and thinker who has devoted his entire life to the cause of education.

**Vice Chancellor**

Mr. Siraj Hussain joined Jamia Hamdard in March 2000 as Vice-Chancellor after a long career in the Indian Administrative Service in the State of Uttar Pradesh and the Centre. Since March 2000, a number of new initiatives have been taken by the University under his dynamic leadership. A new Faculty of Allied Health Sciences has been established to meet the requirement of trained professionals in the areas of Rehabilitation Sciences and Para-medical sciences. A number of building projects have also been initiated and completed in this period. New Buildings of Faculty of Pharmacy, Unani Medicine, Faculty of Nursing and Faculty of Allied Health Sciences are under construction. An International Scholars Hostel is also under construction to accommodate foreign students. A new girls hostel has been constructed which will house 250 girls. He has also been instrumental in setting up campus wide network by linking all the buildings in the Campus through optical fibre cable. The Jamia has been able to get 2 Mbps connectivity from ERNET recently because of his initiative.

Before joining Jamia Hamdard, Mr. Hussain served the Government of India as Deputy Managing Director of National Co-operative Development Corporation which is the premier funding agency for agricultural co-operatives. He was also Private Secretary to Minister of State for Agriculture in the Government of India.

In the State Government of Uttar Pradesh, he has been Secretary, Education; Secretary, Minorities Welfare and Secretary, Panchayati Raj. As Managing Director of U.P. State Industrial Development Corporation, he set up a Software Technology Park in association with IIT, Kanpur.

Hakeem Abdul Hameed, the founder of Jamia Hamdard, had a vision to develop Jamia Hamdard into an institution of excellence imparting modern professional education with special emphasis on Unani medicine and Islamic studies. Today it has evolved into an excellent centre of higher learning, fulfilling the objects of the *wakf* which has been funding the University ever since its inception.

As a mark of tribute and thanks to the Almighty Allah for bestowing His guiding spirit to its founder and his associates, Jamia Hamdard adopted a seal inscribed with the following holy verse (ayat) from the holy Qur'an:

وَيُعَلِّمُهُمُ الْكِتَابَ وَالْحِكْمَةَ .

سورة ٢- آية ١٢٩

“he (the Prophet, may peace be upon him) instructs them in the book and wisdom.”

(Qur'an - 2: 62)

Ever since the inception of Jamia Hamdard, this holy verse (ayat) has been a source of inspiration and guidance for all those associated with its management and administration. As an Islamic charity, wakf has played the vital financial role in the making of Jamia Hamdard. It is ironical that the Muslims continue to be one of the most educationally backward communities of India, despite the fact that acquiring knowledge has been given great emphasis in the holy Qur'an. The Holy Prophet (Pbuh) also emphasised that 'the acquisition of knowledge is obligatory on every Muslim'. He (Pbuh) preached his followers that

*“ wisdom is (like) the lost animal of a believer;  
wherever he finds it, catches hold of it ”*

“Inspired by the Holy Qur'an and exhorted by the Prophet (Pbuh), Muslims became the torch-bearers of knowledge and civilization in the medieval period, but are lagging behind in present times. Late Hakeem Sahib wisely chose education and pursuit of knowledge as his prime objectives when he decided to convert Hamdard Dawakhana into a wakf, a charity dedicated to fulfilling educational and health needs of Indian Muslims. Hamdard (wakf) continues to provide generous grant to the university for buildings, equipments and salaries of staff.

Jamia Hamdard was inaugurated by late Shri Rajiv Gandhi on August 01, 1989. In his impressive speech, the Prime Minister applauded the efforts of Hakeem Abdul Hameed in setting up institutions of learning which were emerging in the form of a “Deemed to be University”. He said, “This will enable (the Muslim) minority to go forward and help India to march forward”.

The University concentrates on professional courses which equip the students to get placements in the highly competitive job market of the country.

**Library**

The library system of Jamia Hamdard consists of Hakeem Mohammad Saeed Central Library and seven faculty libraries. The total library holdings now exceed 1.5 lakhs, including 18,000 bound periodicals, over 20,000 rare collections and over 5,000 manuscripts, 330 theses/dissertations, 370 microfilms, 210



Compact Discs and 584 microfiche. The library receives more than 175 current journals on Science, Pharmacy, Medicine, Management, Information Sciences, Religion and Social Sciences in different languages of the world. The Central Library also has fully developed sections of Binding, Preservation, Art, Calligraphy and Reprography. The facilities of the library are available to all faculty members, research scholars and students who extensively use the library resources. Each faculty library has books on all the disciplines of the faculty.

The Central Library has installed Local Area Network (LAN) with 21 terminals in its all four floors. Three catalogue databases - Book database, Serial database and Thesis database have been developed. The users can access these databases from any terminal and get the required book, journal and thesis immediately.

Library also subscribes to some online journals.

**University Campus wide Information System (CWIS)**

Information Technology has become increasingly crucial to effective acquisition and dissemination of knowledge. Therefore, computer professionals in Jamia Hamdard are adopting best practices for integrating these technologies in support of teaching and learning.


Jamia Hamdard has found a way to meet these goals, including both more effective use of technology in support of education and lower total cost of ownership. New infrastructure based on evolutionary Gigabit Switched Ethernet (IEEE 802.3z) technology has been installed in the University.

All the faculties, libraries, labs, hospital and administrative block located in several buildings, are connected through 6 core 1000Mbps Fiber Optic cables. Residential area and hostels are connected through high speed RAS ports and modems using existing EPABX.

All fibers coming from various buildings are terminated at sophisticated layer-3 CISCO switch in the Administrative block. Fibers at remote ends in different buildings are terminated on Layer-2 CISCO switches. Internal LANs in various buildings are running on Fast 100 Mbps Category-e5 UTP cabling.

Compaq Proliant ML530 server, running MS Windows2000 Server and MS Exchange 2000 server, is providing services round the clock. Five Servers and approximately 400 PCs in various buildings are connected to main server. All faculty members and officials have been provided the e-mail accounts and are able to communicate with each other through the exchange server. University Intranet and Notice Board can be accessed from anywhere in the campus. The students may also be provided the e-mail accounts.

The University has been provided with 2 Mbps leased line by UGC to access internet.



## Majeedia Hospital

Majeedia Hospital is a registered 150 bed multi-discipline hospital providing treatment in Unani as well as modern system of medicine. It has a well-equipped Intensive Care Unit and four Operation Theatres. The hospital has departments of Medicine, Surgery, Gynaecology, Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Ophthalmology, ENT, Dental Surgery, Dermatology. Super specialists in the fields of Cardiology, Nephrology and Plastic Surgery, Endocrinology, Paediatric Surgery and gastroenterology are also available. The hospital also provides dialysis, Urology and Neurosurgery facilities.

The hospital has modern equipments for investigation in the fields of Microbiology, Pathology, Biochemistry, Radiology and Ultrasonology. Further, it has highly qualified and reputed consultants. A private OPD, in addition to general OPD, also functions. The hospital has a Paediatric Nursery for infants. A Centre for Rehabilitation Medicine is also being set up. The hospital provides round the clock, casualty, ambulance and pharmacy services. A Family Welfare Department provides all facilities of community health, immunization and family planning services with the assistance of Delhi Government.

The OPD and Emergency treatments are free for the students.

The Hospital is utilized to give practical training to medical internees, house surgeons, post-graduate, DMLT and Diploma in X-ray and ECG Technology students. Research scholars from faculty of Pharmacy carry out their patient/drugs related research projects at Majeedia Hospital. The Diploma as well as B. Sc. Nursing students are given practical exposure to patient care and ward management in the hospital.

Majeedia Hospital conducts regular CMEs to keep pace with latest in the field of medicine and patient care. Free Medical Camps are organized by the hospital in order to reach out to the underprivileged in the community. With the same aim, it also provides free paediatric and gynaecological consultation at Rufaida Health Centre which serves the people belonging to lower socio-economic strata of society.



## Hamdard Convention Centre

Right from its very inception as a centre of learning and research, Jamia Hamdard has drawn scholars and researchers from all over the world. As its institutions have grown, so has the influx of visitors who come to avail of the wealth of knowledge offered by its institutions and interact with experts with similar interest and

pursuit. To help provide a well-planned and well-equipped centre for such meetings and interaction, Jamia Hamdard now offers a beautifully designed Conference and Convention Centre on its vast campus. Centrally air-conditioned, elegantly furnished and provided with all the modern amenities of an international conference venue, the Hamdard Convention Centre (HCC) is an ideal facility. It is extensively used by the Jamia and other national and international organizations for arranging conferences and seminars.

## Conference Hall

- ◆ 200 seats, with additional capacity for 50.
- ◆ Simultaneous translation facilities in three languages other than the floor language.
- ◆ Facilities of central recording, typing, photocopying of the day's proceedings, and slide and video projection.
- ◆ Other facilities such as LCD projector, overhead projectors, white boards, charts etc, which are required to make a convention successful, are available.

The HCC, in addition to the above, has a Mini Conference Hall, Seminar Room, Press Conference Room, Committee Rooms and Exhibition Hall.

## Hostel

The Jamia has well furnished hostels for girls and boys. In view of limited hostel accommodation, admission in Jamia Hamdard does not necessarily guarantee admission to the hostel. However, the available seats in the hostels for boys are allotted on the basis of seniority-cum merit. Request for hostel accommodation is made to the Provost. It will be incumbent upon the student admitted to the hostel to join the mess and pay mess charges for three months in advance at the rates prescribed from time to time. The students admitted to the hostel are entitled to stay in the hostel during the academic session only and are required to vacate the rooms during the summer vacations. The students are given a copy of Bye-laws of the hostel at the time of admission.

A new hostel for girls has been constructed and all the girl students admitted in 2002 were accommodated in the Girl's Hostel located in the campus.

A new International Boys Hostel for foreign students is being constructed which is likely to be ready by July, 2003.

## Cafeteria

The Cafeteria offers a choice of snacks, lunch and dinner prepared in a modern, hygienic and well-equipped kitchen.



## Scholars' House

An attractively designed 3-storey structure, the Scholars' House offers accommodation for research scholars and delegates to conferences. It provides:

- ♦ 12 air-conditioned rooms with double beds, attached bath, a small lounge, a veranda.
- ♦ 27 single air-conditioned rooms with common bathroom facilities.



- ♦ air-conditioned dining hall with a choice of fine Indian and Continental cuisine.
- ♦ air-conditioned coffee lounge.

## Sports and Recreational Activities

Jamia Hamdard has facilities for playing different games. There are two indoor badminton courts, two tables for table tennis and a hard tennis court. There are grounds for football, basketball and volleyball also. Jamia Hamdard organizes a sports week annually for the students when inter-faculty competitions are held.

## Student Aid Fund

In 2002-03, the University allocated an amount of Rs. 5 Lakhs for "Student Aid Fund". This Fund is utilized for grant of scholarships to the needy students of Jamia Hamdard. Students, the income of whose parents/guardian is less than Rs. 7,500 per month, are eligible for the award of the Scholarships.

Jamia Hamdard took the lead in starting Post-Graduate course in Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy in North India in 1998. The courses were very well received and are in great demand. The Faculty receives help and active support from the renowned hospitals in Delhi for training the students, besides utilizing Majeedia Hospital. The Jamia is in the process of constructing a separate building for the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences with the help of generous grant from the UGC.



The Faculty offers Masters and Bachelors programmes of study in Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy.

## Master of Occupational Therapy (M.O.Th.)

This programme is offered in the following two disciplines.

- ♦ Orthopaedics
- ♦ Paediatrics

<b>Duration:</b>	Two years
<b>Total Seats:</b>	05 in each discipline (Inclusive of one seat reserved for NRI/ Sponsored candidates in each discipline) An additional seat is available for foreign nationals

### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M.O.Th. must have:

- ♦ passed Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (B.O.Th.) from an institution recognized by Jamia Hamdard or University/ Institute approved by UGC securing at least 50% marks in the aggregate.
- ♦ appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

### Selection procedure

For admission to M.O.Th. programme, a written Entrance Test will be conducted. The question paper will be comprised of questions on basic sciences and occupational therapy subjects taught in B.O.Th. The selection will be made on the basis of the merit determined by the marks obtained in the written test only.

For admission against the NRI/sponsored seats, written test is not required.

## Master of Physiotherapy (M.P.Th.)

This programme is offered in the following disciplines.

- ♦ Osteo-myology

- ♦ Cardio-pulmonary
- ♦ Neurology
- ♦ Sports Health

<b>Duration:</b>	Two years

This is the only faculty that offers courses in humanities. The main focus of the Faculty is Islamic studies and Federal Studies in Indian context and its relationship with other civilizations of the world. The Faculty consists of the following department and centres.

- ♦ Department of Islamic Studies
- ♦ Centre for Federal Studies
- ♦ Centre for History of Medicine and Science



## Department of Islamic Studies

The main thrust of research in the department is in the areas which have relevance to the problems faced by the contemporary Muslim world with special reference to the Indian Muslims. These include subjects related to the socio-economic, religious and political problems of Muslims in the contemporary Indian perspective and contribution of Muslims in different walks of life, causes of decline of Muslims in and outside India, issues related to misunderstanding about Islam and Muslims, the impact of Islam on India and vice-versa, contribution of Indian Muslim scholars and noble-men during the medieval period, translations of the outstanding works by Muslim scholars including Muslim scientists and Sufis. Research in Islamic Studies is based on social science approach with modern methodology within the parameters prescribed by Qur'an and Hadees.

The Department offers M. A. (Islamic Studies) and Ph.D. programmes.

### M. A. (Islamic Studies)

<b>Duration:</b>	Two years
<b>Total Seats:</b>	06

### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M. A. in Islamic Studies must have:

- ♦ passed graduation in Islamic Studies or in related disciplines securing at least 50% marks. Also, students who have passed Fazil (Graduation) examination with at least 50% marks from a Madarsa, which is recognized by any of the State Boards of the Madaras and by Jamia Hamdard, are also eligible for admission.
- ♦ proficiency in English and Urdu/Arabic and have knowledge of Theology and teachings of Islam.
- ♦ appeared in entrance test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

Candidates applying for MA (Islamic Studies) are advised to read the list of Madaras/ Boards/ Institutions recognized by Jamia Hamdard on pages 20 and 21.

### Selection Procedure

For admission to M. A. in Islamic Studies, a written Entrance Test is conducted. The test paper comprises of descriptive questions based on the Fazilat syllabus of Madaras and also the B.A. Islamic studies syllabus of universities. The paper has three sections - one section is compulsory for all the candidates and out of the two remaining sections, one is for the candidates who have obtained Fazil sanad from Madaras and the other for the graduates from universities.

The selection is made on the basis of the merit determined by the performance of the candidates in the written test only.

### Ph.D. Programme

#### Eligibility

Candidates seeking admission to Ph.D. in Islamic Studies should have a post-graduate degree in Islamic Studies or allied subjects and should have at least 55% marks in aggregate. Knowledge of English and Arabic or Persian or Urdu is essential.

#### Selection Procedure

Admission to Ph. D. programme is made on the basis of performance of the applicants in a written Entrance Test followed by viva voce of the short-listed candidates. The questions of the test paper are based on the M. A. Islamic Studies syllabus of Jamia Hamdard.

## Centre for Federal Studies

The Centre for Federal Studies (CFS) was incorporated in the Faculty of Islamic Studies and Social Sciences of Jamia Hamdard in August 1994. It works under the Area Studies Programme of the U.G.C.

The CFS is conceived as a centre of advanced study, documentation and research on the problems and aspects of federal polity and plural society in India, reaching out later to the South Asian region and to other parts of the world. It is the only Centre of its kind in India, which exclusively and comprehensively is focused on the study and research of the various dimensions of federalism.

The CFS is currently engaged in research on the wide-spectrum of themes and topics concerning the federal plural polity of India. Its perception of the Indian federal reality covers a broad field of enquiry. The centre has undertaken studies focused on policy-oriented and problem-solving aspects of the emerging Indian federal system which include: Recasting Centre-State relations: Constitutional, Political, Financial and Administrative aspects- an exercise in building a balanced and cooperative federal system in India; Working of India's political system and party system at the three levels-Centre/all India, State/region, and local bodies/Panchayats and Nagarpalikas: areas of convergence and areas of discord; Socio-cultural pluralism in India-ethnic segments, regional and sub-regional identities, religious communities, language group etc.; Problems of tension and co-ordination of pluralism in the process of federal nation-building; Regional movements, demand for smaller states in India; Patterns and folk-traditions of composite culture in different states and regions of India; Dimensions of Caste, Class and Politics in Federal India. The centre publishes a bi-annual international journal, 'Indian Journal of Federal Studies'.

The Centre has Ph.D. programme only.

### Ph.D. Programme

#### Eligibility

Candidates seeking admission to the Ph.D. Programme must possess Master's degree in Political Science/Public Administrations/Sociology/History/Economics, and should have secured at least 55% marks in the aggregate.

#### Selection Procedure

Admission to Ph. D. programme is made on the basis of the performance of the applicants in a written Entrance Test followed by viva voce of the short-listed candidates. The syllabus for the test can be obtained from the Centre.

## Centre for History of Medicine and Science

The Centre for History of Medicine and Science is one of the oldest Centres of learning and research in the Jamia. The main thrust of the research in the Centre is on the development of Unani Medicine in India. Areas of research are:

- ♦ History of development of Unani Medicine in India (Pre-Mughal, Mughal and post -Mughal periods).
- ♦ Preparation of Critical editions of important manuscripts (compiled in India)
- ♦ Basic concepts of Unani Medicine and Ayurveda - A Historical Comparative Study.
- ♦ Influence of Ayurveda over Unani Medicine in the (Pre-Mughal, Mughal and post Mughal periods).
- ♦ Influence of Unani Medicine over Ayurveda in the (Pre-Mughal, Mughal and post- Mughal Periods).
- ♦ Role of Indian Folk Medicine in the development of Unani Medicine.

The Centre also brings out a bi-annual International Journal "Studies in History of Medicine and Science."

The Entrance Tests for admission to Ph.D. programmes will be held in Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi only.

FMSIT has endeavoured to have close interaction with industry through seminars, industrial visits, small projects and guest lectures etc. to enable its students to understand the finer points of business.

The Faculty strives to provide the students with the most up-to-date knowledge in the field of Management and in the dynamic environment of Computers and Information Technology. This is the reason that our students have found ready acceptance in industry. Alumni of FMSIT are occupying responsible positions in the corporate world, in India and abroad.



The Faculty of Management Studies & Information Technology offers management and computer education at graduate, post-graduate and doctoral levels to its students with the following aims:

- ♦ To train them as managers and executives, to serve public and private sector organizations of the country and to work for Indian business houses and multinational corporations in India and abroad.
- ♦ To fulfill national manpower requirements in the field of business management and information technology.
- ♦ To undertake research in the field of business and commerce and computer science.

The Faculty of Medicine (Unani) has evolved from Hamdard Tibbi College which was established in 1963. It has been recognized as one of the centres of higher education and research in Unani medicine by Ministry of Health, Govt. of India. The Faculty conducts teaching and research in Unani Medicine and Surgery. The curriculum has been designed in such a way that the students are exposed to the fundamental theories and basic principles of Unani System of Medicine as well as modern medical subjects such as Physiology, Social and Preventive Medicine, Pharmacology, Pathology and Forensic Medicine.

No stipend is available to the students of M.D. (Moalijat) and M.D. (Ilmul Advia) from the Department of ISM, Ministry of Health, Govt. of India. Jamia Hamdard may consider providing stipend of Rs. 2500 per month in some deserving cases.

M.D. students may be posted in the Majeedia Hospital on roster basis. M.D. (Tahaffuzt-wo-samaji Tibb) students may be posted at Rufaida Health Centre.

The candidate should have studied English in 10th standard.

The D.G.N.M. students will be provided free hostel accommodation and a monthly stipend as approved from time to time. Those students who drop out at any stage after admission will be liable to refund the entire amount of stipend paid to them.

### Selection procedure

For admission to the Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery programme, a written entrance test will be conducted to test the knowledge of the candidates in General Awareness (Gen. The Faculty of Pharmacy, which was formerly known as Hamdard College of Pharmacy, is one of the most prestigious institutions of Pharmacy education in India. A sizable number of students of the Faculty qualify GATE securing high percentile. In the year 2002, as many as 48 students qualified GATE. Students also get placements in major pharmaceutical companies after obtaining degrees from Jamia Hamdard. This is also the only place where Unani Pharmacy education is imparted.

The Faculty has a Computer Centre housing 30 PCs with interne/intranet connections. The Central Instrumentation Facility of the Faculty is equipped with modern equipments.

The Faculty consists of the following departments.

- ◆ Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry
- ◆ Department of Pharmaceutics
- ◆ Department of Pharmacology
- ◆ Department of Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry

The Faculty lays emphasis on integrated research in modern and indigenous systems of medicine. The thrust areas of investigation in the departments are as under.

### Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry

Areas of research include synthesis of new compounds of potential pharmaceutical interest, studies on pro-drugs and synthesis of glycosides including biological evaluation of these products, isolation and characterization of constituents from indigenous medicinal plants and standardization of Unani drugs.

### Department of Pharmaceutics

The department has developed up-to-date and modern state of art facilities for research in contemporary and futuristic areas of importance to Pharmaceutical sciences, particularly in the development of drug delivery systems and product development of pharmaceutical dosage forms.

### Department of Pharmacology

The department conducts research in psychopharmacological drugs, evaluation of medicinal agents and dosage forms with particular reference to indigenous drugs. Studies on potassium-channel opener and calcium-channel blockers and drugs acting on CVS are also carried out. Other areas of studies include research on drugs used in liver disorders and diabetes mellitus. Training in clinical Pharmacology is also provided.

The main areas of research include isolation, identification and evaluation of constituents of natural drugs, plant tissue culture and its applications and herbal cosmetics.

## Ph.D. Programme

### Eligibility

Candidates should have passed M. Pharm. from Jamia Hamdard or from any other institution recognized by AICTE and Jamia Hamdard in the relevant subject securing at least 55% marks in the aggregate.

### Selection procedure

Admission to Ph. D. programme is made on the basis of the performance of the candidates in a written Entrance Test followed by viva voce of the short-listed candidates. The questions of the test paper are based on the M. Pharm. syllabus of the relevant discipline.

**The Entrance Tests will be held in Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi only.**

The Faculty consists of the following departments and centre.

- ♦ Department of Biochemistry
- ♦ Department of Botany
- ♦ Department of Chemistry
- ♦ Department of Medical Elementology and Toxicology
- ♦ Centre for Biotechnology


The teachers in the Faculty are involved in research with an objective to understand the etiology of diseases and inter-relationship between nutrients and drugs. The new emerging concept of role of elements in health and diseases is also being studied. Scientific evaluation of the efficacy of herbal medicine is an area that is being extensively pursued. Other areas of research include the effect of environment on growth, development, structure and chemistry of plants, relationship between structure and function of proteins and enzymes, development of biomolecules by r-DNA technology, regulation of gene expression, vaccine development, enhancement of secondary metabolites in medicinal plants, molecular biology of infectious diseases, biotransformation of medicinal plants for better yield of medicinal compounds and transgenics of vegetable, floriculture and oil crops.

The major research facilities in the departments of the Faculty include Electrophoresis System, Photosynthesis System, Leaf Area Metre, High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) apparatus, Ultrasonicator, Automatic ELISA Reader and ELISA plate washer, Lyophilizer, Luminescence Spectrophotometer, UV-visible Spectrophotometers, Carbon-di-oxide Incubator, Spectrofluorimeter, Gel Laser Densitometer, Sequencing Gel Analyzer, Gel dryer, Ice Machine, Transilluminator, Environmental Shaker Incubators, Complete facility of microtomy and microscopy, Weather Station, Cold Room, Green House, Fully-controlled Glass House, Culture facilities for Mammalian cells and Plant Tissues, Buchi rota-vapors, Growth Chambers, BOD incubators, PCR, and Minus 80 deep-freezer.

An independent Animal House is attached with the Faculty.

### Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF)

The Faculty has a well equipped Central Instrumentation Facility which is open to research scholars round the clock. It is equipped with state-of-art equipments required for biomedical research. These include Atomic absorption and Atomic emission Spectrophotometers, inductively coupled plasma spectrophotometer, JASCO Spectropolarimeter, Ultracentrifuges, HPLC with integrator, Gas chromatograph, Balance, Gamma and Beta Scintillation Counters, Ultrosan, FT-IR, Luminescence Spectrometer, UV-VIS Double Beam Spectrophotometer, Gel



Documentation System and Semi-preparative HPLC. Facilities for Internet, and DTP are also available in the Computer Centre of the Faculty of Science. All the departments of the Faculty are connected to the server of the CIF.

The Faculty offers M.Sc. programmes in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Chemistry - Industrial Applications, Environmental Botany and Toxicology.

Research courses leading to the award of Ph.D. degree are offered by all the departments of the Faculty. The research funds of the Faculty come from funding agencies like World Bank, DBT, DST, CSIR, ISM, ICAR, DOD, DOE, ICMR, CCRUM, etc. The departments of the faculty have received grants from the Department of Science and Technology (DST) under the FIST scheme.

### Department of Biochemistry

The Department has established itself as an excellent centre of Biochemistry teaching in north India. A large number students who passed M.Sc. Biochemistry from the Department have qualified various national level tests such as NET, GATE and the test conducted by ICMR for the award of research fellowships/lecturership. A majority of the students have been selected for Ph.D. programmes of prestigious institutions of the country such as AIIMS, Centre of DNA Finger Printing, CCMB, Institute of Genomics and Interactive Biology, JNU, PGI, Delhi University etc. as well as of institutions abroad.

The major areas of research in the Department are isolation, purification and physio-chemical characterization of proteins and enzymes, mechanism of protein folding, protein stability, cell and molecular biology of liver diseases, role of mineral elements in prevention and cure of diseases, biochemical validation and safety standardization of herbs used in Unani system of medicine, preparation and validation of blended cooking oils, oxidative stress, regulation and modulation of gene expression, control and prevention of mycotoxin contamination in oil seed plants,



development of effective antimicrobial agents of plant origin and drug-DNA interaction as well as chemical carcinogenesis.

### M.Sc. Biochemistry

#### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M.Sc. programme in Biochemistry must have:

- ♦ passed B.Sc. or equivalent examination with Biochemistry or Chemistry as one of the subjects securing at least 55% marks in the aggregate.
- ♦ appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

#### Selection procedure

For admission to M. Sc. programme in Biochemistry, a written Entrance Test will be conducted to test the knowledge of the candidates in general Biochemistry, Biology, Chemistry and Molecular Biology of B.Sc. level. The selection will be made on the basis of merit determined by the performance of the candidates in written test only.

For admission against the NRI/sponsored seats, written test is not required

### Department of Botany

Research activities in the department focus on (a) effects of environmental stress, including heavy metal as well as air pollution stress on development, growth and metabolic activities of plants and on the therapeutic properties of medicinal plants, (b) conservation biology, clonal multiplication, cultivation and preservation of endangered plant species, (c) micropropagation of rare plants and regulation of biosynthesis of secondary metabolites through tissue culture techniques, (d) evaluation of ethnomedicinal claims through pharmacognostic, biochemical and pharmacological studies, and (e) nutrition-induced resistance in field crops against biotic

and abiotic stresses. The department is well equipped for conducting such studies.

Many students of the previous batches of M.Sc. (Environmental Botany) have qualified NET and Civil Service examinations. Many have joined research programmes at reputed institutions like IIT, New Delhi, IISc, Bangalore, IARI, New Delhi, FRI, Dehra Dun, IHBT, Palampur, TERI, New Delhi and DU, etc.

### M.Sc. Environmental Botany

(Inclusive of seats reserved for NRIs. Additional seats are provided for foreign nationals)

#### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M.Sc. programme in Environmental Botany must have:

- ♦ passed B.Sc. or equivalent examination of a recognized university with Botany /Plant Sciences as one of the subjects and secured at least 55% marks in the aggregate.
- ♦ appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

#### Selection procedure

For admission to M. Sc. programme in Environmental Botany, a written Entrance Test will be conducted to test the knowledge of the candidates in the entire Botany of B.Sc. standard with special emphasis on plant ecology, physiology, plant growth and development, plant biotechnology and medicinal botany. The selection will be made on the basis of merit determined by the performance of the candidates in the written test only.

For admission against the NRI/sponsored seats, written test is not required.

### Department of Chemistry

The major areas of research in the department include the isolation and characterization of biopharmaceuticals from natural source, synthesis of new compounds of industrial interest as well as emerging technologies in drug delivery system. The Department has launched M.Sc. programme in Chemistry - Industrial Applications with an objective to produce professionally trained post-graduate chemists for pharmaceutical, food, cosmetic, polymer, petroleum and allied industries.

## M.Sc. Chemistry-Industrial Applications

<b>Total Seats:</b>	12 (Inclusive of seats reserved for NRIs. Additional seats are provided for foreign nationals)

### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M.Sc. programme in Chemistry must have:

- ♦ passed B.Sc. or equivalent examination from a recognized university with Chemistry as one of the subjects and secured at least 55% marks in the aggregate.
- ♦ appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

### Selection procedure

For admission to M. Sc. programme in Chemistry - Industrial Applications, a written Entrance Test will be conducted to test the knowledge of the candidates in all the aspects of Chemistry (Physical, Inorganic, Organic and Analytical). The selection will be made on the basis of the merit determined by the performance of the candidates in the written test only.

For admission against the NRI/sponsored seats, written test is not required

## Department of Medical Elementology and Toxicology

The major areas of research in the department include the role of elements in biological systems, toxic manifestations and abnormalities caused by the excessive exposure or the deficiency of elements, mechanistic aspects of chemical carcinogenesis, oxidative stress, chemoprevention aspects of disease control using herbal preparations, and ecotoxicological evaluation of agricultural and industrial chemicals. The department has laboratories of Neurobehavioural Toxicology, Predictive Toxicology and Environmental Monitoring, Risk Assessment and Safety Evaluation, Chemical Carcinogenesis, Reproductive and Developmental Toxicology, Metal Toxicology Chemoprevention and Nutrition Toxicology, Ecotoxicology, Immunotoxicology, in vitro toxicology and Analytical Toxicology. Some students after obtaining M.Sc. degree in Toxicology have been placed in major pharmaceutical companies such as Ranbaxy, Torrent, Cadila, Dabur etc. in their Toxicology Units.

## M.Sc. Toxicology

<b>Duration:</b>	Two years
<b>Total Seats:</b>	20 (Inclusive of seats reserved for NRIs. Additional seats are provided for foreign nationals)

### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M.Sc. programme in Toxicology must have:

- ♦ passed B.Sc. or equivalent examination from a recognized university with any three of Botany, Chemistry, Zoology, Biochemistry or any other subject of Life Sciences and secured at least 55% marks in the aggregate. Candidates who are B.Sc. in Chemistry/Biochemistry/Biology and have also obtained B.U.M.S./B.Pharm. or other professional degree from Jamia Hamdard will also be eligible to compete for admission to the course. The criterion of 55% marks at B. Sc. level shall be relaxed in their cases.
- ♦ appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

### Selection procedure

For admission to M.Sc. programme in Toxicology, a written Entrance Test will be conducted to test the knowledge of the candidates in Chemistry, Biochemistry, Botany and Zoology of B.Sc. level. The selection will be made on the basis of the merit determined by the performance of the candidates in the written test only.

For admission against the NRI/sponsored seats, written test is not required.

## Centre for Biotechnology

The major areas of research are: cloning and expression of mammalian genes; production of hormones and other biomolecules of medical importance by genetic engineering route using bacterial, insect and mammalian cell systems; molecular biology of infectious diseases; development of DNA based diagnostic probes and vaccines; molecular mechanism of herbal drug action; micropropagation of medicinal plants and high yielding individuals; enhancing the yield of secondary metabolites; use of bioreactors and immobilized cells; transgenic plants; in vivo and in vitro induced abiotic factors and their impact on plant growth, differentiation and secondary metabolite biosynthesis; and Biochemical and molecular characterization of stress resistance in plants.

## M.Sc. Biotechnology

**Duration:** Two years

**Total Seats:** 14

(Inclusive of seats reserved for NRIs. Additional seats are provided for foreign nationals)

### Eligibility

A candidate seeking admission to M.Sc. programme in Biotechnology must have:

- ♦ passed B.Sc. or equivalent examination from a recognized university in Biological Sciences with a minimum of 55% marks in the aggregate. The candidates having passed B.Sc. (Agriculture) or B.V.Sc. are also eligible.
- ♦ appeared in the Entrance Test conducted by Jamia Hamdard.

### Selection procedure

For admission to M.Sc. programme in Biotechnology, a written Entrance Test will be conducted to test the knowledge of the candidates in Biology, Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Chemistry and Molecular Biology of B.Sc. level. The selection will be made on the basis of the merit determined by the performance of the candidates in the written test only.

For admission against the NRI/sponsored seats, written test is not required.

## Ph.D. Programme

### Eligibility

The Faculty offers Ph.D. in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Botany and Toxicology. Candidates seeking admission to the Ph.D. programme in the Faculty should have passed M.Sc. in the relevant subject securing at least 55% marks in the aggregate. Departments of Biotechnology and Medical Elementology and Toxicology accept candidates to Ph.D. programme who possess M.Sc. degree in Chemistry or any subject of Biological Sciences.

Some fellowships sponsored by HNF are available for award to deserving candidates. Some candidates can be supported by appointing them as Junior Research Fellows in research projects sponsored by various funding agencies of the Government of India. Preference is given to those candidates who have qualified UGC-CSIR NET or the test conducted by ICMR.

1. The applicants are advised to carefully read the contents of this prospectus and familiarize themselves with the relevant rules governing the admission/entrance test/interview etc. of Jamia Hamdard. They should also check all the eligibility criteria including age requirement for a particular programme. **Marks obtained which are less even by a fraction shall not be rounded off to the next whole number to determine the eligibility.** University will not be responsible if a candidate is denied admission for not fulfilling the eligibility criteria even if he/she has cleared the entrance test.
2. In this Prospectus, information regarding admission is given only in brief. Rules of eligibility are followed strictly. The University, however, reserves the right to refuse admission to an individual without assigning any reason. A candidate shall not be entitled to claim admission as a matter of right even if he/she is otherwise eligible. Furthermore, if any error/omission in the processing/verification of certificates/documents of any candidate is made by the University at the time of admission, the University has the right to cancel such admission at any stage when such error is discovered.
3. Issue of Admit Card and appearing in Entrance Test by a candidate does not confer any right to claim admission if the candidate does not fulfill all the eligibility conditions prescribed by Jamia Hamdard.
4. Application found to be incomplete or not submitted on the prescribed form or those submitted after the last date shall not be entertained in any case. **No relaxation in the last date will be granted.** However, those applications which are received after the last date but bear a postal stamp showing last date or an earlier date will be accepted if they are received within couple of days after the last date.
5. The University takes no responsibility for any delay in postal transit or non-receipt of Application Form/Admit Card/Interview Letter/Intimation Letter etc. or any other communication relating to admission.
6. **No request for change in address at any stage will be entertained.** In case of any change in the address for correspondence, the candidate must inform the concerned Post Office to re-direct his/her correspondence at his/her new/changed address to avoid any delay in receiving intimation etc.
7. Candidates who **do not get the Admit Card** must report to the Admission Section one day before the date of the Written Entrance Test or on the day of Entrance Test at the Test Centre itself to collect duplicate Admit Card. Such candidates are required to bring two photographs, duly attested, for the purpose. Candidates who have opted for a test centre other than Delhi, may reach the Test Centre an hour before the test with two attested photographs and collect the duplicate Admit Card.
8. **The University has the right to change the schedule and venue of the entrance test/interview etc. due to any unforeseen circumstances.**
9. The changes made in admission rules and /or in the eligibility criteria by the University, from time to time, will also be applicable for the candidates seeking admission during the academic session 2003-04.
10. If it is discovered at any stage that a candidate has made a false or incorrect statement or used fraudulent means for admission or does not fulfill the eligibility requirements, he/she will not be allowed to complete admission formalities. If admission has been completed, it can be cancelled at any stage.
11. Candidates getting Supplementary/Compartment/Essential Repeat in the qualifying examination are not entitled to get admission in the same year even if they qualify the Entrance Test. Candidates who take admission by withholding information will not be entitled for refund of fees after cancellation of their admission.
12. A candidate already enrolled in any programme of study/class of Jamia Hamdard will be required to get his/her admission cancelled from the programme he/she is pursuing in this University to be eligible for admission to another programme.
13. The medium of all Tests, except Pre-Tibb and M.A. Islamic Studies, is English.
14. Convassing for admission in any form by a candidate would lead to rejection of his/her application form.
15. All the matters of dispute shall be subject to Delhi jurisdiction.

### For the kind attention of the Parents/Guardians

16. Once your ward is admitted in Jamia Hamdard to a programme of study, please discuss with him/her the rules and bye-laws governing that programme.
17. To appear in the annual/semester examination, 75% attendance in class is necessary. Please impress upon your ward to communicate his/her attendance to you at the end of each term.
18. At the end of every academic session, please check the marks sheet of your ward and acquaint yourself with his/her performance.

## Reservation/ Relaxation

Reservation and/or relaxation to various categories of applicants will be available as per the university rules. As an institution set up under Article 30(1) of the Constitution of India, Jamia Hamdard reserves 50% of the seats for Muslims. Relaxation of 5% in the required percentage of marks for the eligibility will be given to SC/ST candidates provided a copy of certificate from the competent authority is enclosed. Candidates will be required to produce original certificate at the time of admission.

## Physically handicapped candidates

A candidate in order to be eligible for any concession/benefit under this category, should have minimum degree of disability to the extent of 40%. Physically handicapped candidates will have to submit certificate from the competent authority. The certifying authority in all such cases will be a medical board at the district level consisting of Chief Medical Officer (CMO), Sub-Divisional Medical Officer in the district and another expert in the specified field, viz., Ophthalmic Surgeon in the case of visually handicapped, ENT surgeon or Audiologist for hearing speech handicapped and an Orthopaedic Surgeon or a Specialist in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation in the case of locomotor handicapped. Furthermore, a candidate will become eligible for the benefit under PH category subject to his/her claim being verified by the Medical Board of Majeedia Hospital, Jamia Hamdard. This board will also ascertain that the physical disability is not considered as a hindrance in pursuing the program of study that the candidate wishes to be admitted to. Decision of this board will be final and binding.

## Sportsperson

Distinguished sportspersons who play the games of **Badminton, Basketball, Cricket, Football, Table Tennis and Volleyball** will be eligible to be considered for the benefit under this category, if he/she produces certificate from the competent authority that he/she has:

- ♦ Represented state in the national games/championships (certificate from national/state association is to be submitted).
- ♦ Represented India in an international meet (certificate from Ministry of Sports to be submitted).

Candidates who have certificates of participation at lower levels than the above will not be given any consideration.

Candidates who will be selected under the above category will be required to undergo a trial conducted by the University to verify their claim.

Decision of the University in this regard will be final.

2. The Prospectus and Application Form may be obtained from Prof. M.A. Baig, Chairman, Admission Committee, Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi-110 062 by sending a crossed Bank Draft of US \$ 10 or Indian rupees 500/-. The candidates may apply on the Form by enclosing the prescribed fee which is as under:

However, foreign nationals from SAARC countries will pay US \$ 500 less for every course except for Ph.D. in Islamic Studies. In case of Ph.D. in Islamic Studies, the fee for foreign nationals from SAARC countries will be US \$ 300.

## Submission of Application Form

1. The cost of application form, along with Prospectus, is Rs 200.

The admission forms will be given free of cost to children of all the categories of Jamia Hamdard employees.

2. The Entrance Test/Registration fee (non-refundable) is as follows:

For all the Diploma Programmes and M.A. (Islamic Studies)	Rs. 100 Each.
For all other programmes	Rs. 300 Each.

Those who download the application form from the web site must add Rs. 200 to the Entrance Test/Registration fee.

**The fee must be paid in the form of a crossed Demand Draft drawn in favour of Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi payable at New Delhi.**

Son/daughter of a group C or D employee of Jamia Hamdard is completely exempted from paying the Entrance Test Fee. Son/daughter of a group A or B employee of Jamia Hamdard has to pay only half of the prescribed Entrance Test Fee.

3. The application Form, complete in all respects, together with crossed Demand Draft of requisite amount (non-refundable) should reach the Chairman, **Admission Committee on or before April 19, 2003.**
4. The copies of the following documents are required to be submitted along with the Application Form: **(Do not staple the documents with the form. Use U-clip).**
  - ♦ Marks sheet of the qualifying examination passed, if the result has been declared.
  - ♦ Marks sheets of all other examinations passed (including I year and II year of graduate examinations wherever applicable).
  - ♦ Certificate of Date of Birth.
  - ♦ Certificate in respect of claim of benefit under any category.
5. In case of the candidates who are to appear in the final year examination in 2003, the marks sheet must be submitted immediately after the declaration of result or by July 30, 2003 whichever is earlier failing which his/her admission will be cancelled. Entrance Test Roll Number and Name of the programme(s) must be mentioned on the marks sheet.

If result is not declared by a board/university by the deadline, the admission will be provisional. After the declaration of the result, if the candidate does not secure

the requisite marks, his/her admission will be cancelled and no claim for refund of the fee deposited will be entertained.

6. Some cases of FAKE marks sheets/documents were detected when the University sent them to the concerned College/University for verification of the authenticity of marks sheets/documents issued by the respective College/University. If it is discovered that a selected candidate has used a fake marks sheet/document to secure admission in Jamia Hamdard, his/her admission will be cancelled and strict action will be taken as per rules.

### Declaration of Selection Lists

1. List of candidates who will be selected for admission to various programmes of study will be displayed on the University Notice Board, the web site of the University: **www.jamiahamdard.edu** and at the test centres. Last dates given for completion of admission are strictly observed. The University will not be responsible in case a candidate fails to get information about his/her admission. It is the responsibility of the candidate to keep himself /herself informed about such notice on the Notice Board/web site.
2. A candidate who does not report for admission on the given date and time as mentioned in the selection lists, will forfeit his/her chance and the offer of admission will be given to the next candidate in the merit.
3. Jamia Hamdard has right not to disclose the marks obtained by the selected/non-selected candidates in the entrance test/viva voce/group discussion and their position in the merit list.
4. Candidates not selected for admission shall not be informed about their non-selection. Their applications for admission and the fees/certificates/documents submitted by them shall not be returned.
5. Telephonic enquiry about results will not be entertained.

### Completion of Admission




