1. **Jamia Hamdard University (JHU)**

Jamia Hamdard came into existence in 1989 when the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, declared it a “Deemed to be University” on the recommendations of the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Section 3 of UGC Act 1956. It was realization of dream of its Founder Hakeem Abdul Hameed, a great philanthropist and educationist of his time, who invested the profits from his fledgling industrial house “Hamdard Dawakhana” in the education mission. Since its inauguration, Jamia Hamdard has strived to maintain high standard of education to meet the challenges at local and international levels.

Today the University comprises HIMSR (Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences & Research), School of Unani Medical Education and Research, School of Pharmaceutical Education & Research, School of Nursing Sciences and Allied Health, School of Chemical & Life Sciences, School of Interdisciplinary Sciences & Technology, School of Engineering Sciences & Technology, School of Humanities & Social Sciences School of Management & Business Studies and Hamdard Institute of Legal Studies and Research. Each of these schools have made their own mark in academics and research.

In recognition of the University’s contribution to high quality teaching and research, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), a constituent body of the University Grants Commission, has conferred on it ‘A+’ Grade. Jamia Hamdard has tried to maintain these standards and has been able to attract talented students and faculty from globally. Currently, students from over 30 nationalities are enrolled in the University in different courses. This speaks volumes of the reach and quality of the University’s academic profile and establishes it as one of the leading universities of the country.

2. Jamia Hamdard Residential Coaching Academy (JHRCA)

Jamia Hamdard Residential Coaching Academy (JHRCA) was established in September, 2009 under the aegis of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and the University Grants Commission.

The main thrust of the JHRCA is to prepare aspirants to compete and secure jobs in Government and Public Sector Units. Academic support and guidance along with personality development interventions are emphasized at the Academy for holistic development of candidates to face the stiff competition for entry into various services. The academy maintains a special focus on Women, Minorities and SC/ST aspirants.

3. Collaboration

To strengthen the academic preparation of aspirants, JHRCA enters into a collaborative academic arrangement, with a nationally recognized specialized institution

The collaboration aims to enhance the quality of academic preparation through the integration of structured learning resources, curated current affairs support, and systematic testing frameworks.

It is proposed to tie up with Level Up for the year 2026-2027.

4. What we Provide

4.1. The Civil Services Coaching Programme at JHRCA has been designed to prepare aspirants for all three stages of the Civil Services Examination — Preliminary Examination, Main Examination, and the Personality Test. The programme emphasizes a balanced approach combining conceptual learning, structured testing, analytical skill development, and personality development.

4.2 Programme Highlights

4.2.1. Comprehensive academic coverage of the Civil Services Examination syllabus. (General Studies, CSAT, Essay Writing for PT and Mains).

4.2.2. Focus on **conceptual clarity, analytical understanding, and examination** strategy.

4.2.3. Regular mentoring and academic guidance to support preparation

4.2.4. Regular test series and essay writing practice sessions.

4.2.5. Integration of **current affairs with core General Studies subject** through CA classes

4.2.6. Previous Year Question Analysis

4.2.7. Access to academic resources and library facilities

4.3. General Studies

The programme provides structured academic coverage of major areas of the Civil Services syllabus covering both PT & Mains in respect to:

- Indian Polity and Governance
- Indian Economy
- Geography
- Environment and Ecology
- History and Culture
- Science and Technology
- Contemporary Issues and Current Affairs

4.4 Academic Coverage (Mains) will be provided in only a select number of optional subjects.

4.5 Mentorship and Academic Guidance

Students receive continuous mentoring and academic guidance on preparation strategies, answer writing, time management, and examination planning.

4.6 Structured Testing and Evaluation

Regular tests and evaluation exercises are conducted to help students assess their preparation levels and improve their examination strategy.

4.7 Current Affairs Integration

The programme provides curated academic support for current affairs, enabling aspirants to relate to dynamic national and international developments with the basic syllabus of the examination.

4.8 Previous Year Question Analysis

Students are guided through systematic analysis of previous years' questions in order to understand the evolving pattern and conceptual depth of the Civil Services Examination.

4.9 The Team

The contextual and required lectures and interactive sessions are conducted by qualified and competent resource persons, drawn from respective fields and expertise. The coaching program, spread over a period of 10 months, is rigorous and intensive. Regular written tests are conducted to evaluate the performances of the Candidates.

In addition, personality development of the candidates is emphasized by personal support and guidance. Group discussions and debates among candidates are encouraged to develop communication skills.

5. Infrastructure and Facilities

JHRCA is located in the main campus of Jamia Hamdard at Hamdard Nagar, New Delhi. Amongst other things JHRCA has:

5.1 Library

There is a dedicated Library for the candidates of the academy. Newspapers, periodicals, books and written materials for various examinations are available in the library. The library is open for 18 hours a day on all days of the week. Candidates can also avail the facilities at the Central Library of the University.

5.2 Hostel

AC Hostel facility is provided to all admitted candidates on sharing basis. Hostel rooms are equipped with all the basic amenities. Mess facility is open to all the residents of hostel on payment. The hostel facilities would be provided till 31st May 2027. For more details visit jamiahamdard.ac.in

6. Admission Process

Admission to the JHRCA (CS Programme) is through a transparent and merit-based selection process, designed to identify motivated and committed aspirants. A national test followed by personal interaction is the method adopted. **Applications forms can be accessed online at www.jamiahamdard.ac.in/jhrca post issue of admission notice.**

6.1 NATIONAL LEVEL WRITTEN TEST:

National Level Written Test to be conducted at Jamia Hamdard University Campus, New Delhi-110062.

6.1.1 Paper I: General Studies

100 objective types multiple choice questions covering the following:
History, Geography, Indian Economy and Polity, Constitution of India, Art and Culture, Social issues, Science and Technology, Current Affairs-National and International importance.

Time: 2 hours

Max. Marks: 200

(1/3 marks will be deducted for each wrong answer)

6.1.2 Paper II: CSAT

100 objective types multiple choice questions covering the following:
Logical Reasoning and Analytical Ability, General Mental Ability and Quantitative Aptitude.

Time: 2 hours

Max Marks: 200

(1/3 marks will be deducted for each wrong answer)

Those who qualify in the written test would be called for Personal Interview (PI).

Max. Marks: 50

6.1.3. In event of sufficient response JHRCA at its own discretion may organize the written tests at selected centres outside of Delhi.

7. Eligibility & Condition of Admission

7.1. Candidates who have completed or are appearing in the final year of their Bachelor's Degree from an UGC recognized university are eligible to apply.

7.2. The upper age limit for admission 30 years as on 01-01-2026 for General category & 32 years for the rest.

7.3 Candidates who have appeared in CSE Mains in 2024 or 2025 will be given preference.

7.4 Seats

Merit: 50 seats

SFS: A limited number of seats (15) will be available for aspirants on Self Financing basis. They will have to pay a differential fee. **A separate merit list will be drawn for applicants in this category.**

Note: JHRCA may increase or decrease the seats at its sole discretion

7.6 JHRCA/JHU may at its discretion offer up to 50% fee remission to aspirants belonging to extremely indigent families admitted under merit category

7.7 Admission cycle will run from 01-08-2026 to 31-05-2027 i.e. 10 months

8. Terms and Conditions

8.1 Candidates admitted for 2026 batch would be required to attend all the activities including classes, test series etc. as notified by JHRCA from time to time. The candidates will have to mark their daily attendance in the Office of the academy. Monthly attendance of 60% is mandatory and it will be counted quarterly and the admission of those having less than 60% attendance will be cancelled.

8.2 Candidates who are doing full/part time course from any institute/organization or are employed anywhere at the time of admission will not be entertained in the academy. Those who subsequent to the admission pick up a full/part time job will have their admission cancelled forthwith.

8.3 The University Rules regarding the Hostel and the Mess will be applicable to all the admitted candidates.

8.4 Any aspirant who has availed the JHRCA-JHU hostel facility for 3 years over a time span of last 6 years i.e. 2021 onwards is not eligible to apply.

8.5 Any aspirants whose admission was cancelled in last 6 years i.e. 2021 onwards is not eligible to apply.

10. Admission cancellation policy:

If any candidate after taking admission in the Academy wants to withdraw his/her admission then the following policy will be applicable.

- Security deposit will be forfeited if admission is cancelled within 30 days from the date of admission.
- Security deposit will be forfeited and a sum of Rs 10000 will be deducted if admission is cancelled within 60 days from the date of admission.
- Security deposit will be forfeited and a sum of Rs. 25000 will be deducted if admission is cancelled within 90 days from the date of admission.
- Security deposit will be forfeited and a sum of Rs. 35000 will be deducted if admission is cancelled within 120 days from the date of admission.
