Sub: Regularization of Admissions of 2024 Batch MBBS students and Holding of their 1st MBBS Professional Exams – regarding - Non production of admission records of MBBS 2024 Batch students in HIMSR in terms of directions issued by National Medical Commission vide letter dated 24.7.2025 & 15.09.2025

Sir,

This has reference to university letter F.No. JH/Exams/HIMSR/2025/ECOR/124, dated 06.09.2025 wherein you were directed to make available the following records in original for the consideration of the Committee constituted by the Academic Council to consider the cases of the regularization of MBBS 2024 batch students: -

- a) A complete list of all Students of MBBS 2024 Batch admitted in HIMSR in the along with all basic information (contact details of students) along with Tuition fee and other fees collected by HIMSR from the students (up-to-date) for verification purpose for regularization of admissions.
- b) original documents/admission records and affidavits obtained from all 23 students who were admitted against NRI quota for verification along with the list of eligible candidates for counselling under NRI quota released by MCC/NMC.
- 2. The above documents are supposed to make available to the Committee by 10th Sept 2025 (AN) through the office of the Controller of Examinations.
- 3. Being the nodal officer of admission notified by HIMSR on the MCC website (copy attached) and you have collected several admission related records from all 150 admitted students in HIMSR after the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) for deemed to be University category acting on behalf of the Jamia Hamdard (deemed to be University) for admission in HIMSR, you have intentionally delayed the production of admission records.
- 4. Your attention is invited to the direction given by the NMC while rejecting the 1<sup>st</sup> Appeal against the order dated 23.7.2025, communicated by Dr. Raghav Langer, IAS, Secretary, National Medical Commission (NMC) had directed Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) to take all necessary steps to ensure the academic continuity of these students and to maintain regulatory compliances under the relevant provisions of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and National Medical Commission (NMC) Regulations (Copy enclosed).
- 5. Being the Nodal Officer for admission, you had reportedly collected several documents, affidavits, undertakings from the medical students MBBS 2024 batch (list attached) but now refused to share with the Jamia Hamdard for regularisation of admission and also for issuing enrolment number etc. These documents are institutional documents belong to Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) and refusing to sharing these admission related documents is ultimately

harming the interest of the Bonafide students who have sought admission in the Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) in MBBS programme under HIMSR.

- 6. Your attention is invited to clause 24 of the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be University) Regulation under which, admission of the students in a deemed to be University, public, of selffinancing shall be strictly based on merit in the entrance examinations conducted by the Government agency and in the case of MBBS it is MCC in the manner specified in the prospectus of the deemed to be University. The UGC Regulations further mandates the Jamia Hamdard being a deemed to be University shall maintain the records of the entire process of selection of candidates, exhibit such records on its website, and preserve such records for a minimum period of five years.
- 7. It is reiterated that HIMSR is not an affiliated college of Jamia Hamdard but established by Jamia Hamdard as one of the Schools of Jamia Hamdard. All statutory approvals to run the medical courses from NMC and Govt. of NCT of Delhi are in the name of Jamia Hamdard and not in the name of any other society or trust or committee as wrongly claimed. These facts could be verified from the NMC and JH website (www.himsr.ac.in). It is also reiterated that Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (HIMSR) is part of Jamia Hamdard with no independent legal status. HIMSR has not been granted with any autonomous status or any special status by the University Grants Commission or any statutory authority. The NMC in its order dated 15.09.2025 has directed to take all necessary steps for regularization of the students of MBBS Batch 2024 as per the UGC and NMC Regulations. Hence the admission documents are crucial for the Jamia Hamdard before these students are regularized and enrolled in the Jamia Hamdard. Hence, the Jamia Hamdard has every right to seek the official admission records from HIMSR and noncompliance may further delay the process of regularization of these students.
- The University will not recognize any correspondence from illegal persons claiming to be the officiating Dean of HIMSR. Prof. Sudhir Kumar Jain is presently the Principal/Dean of HIMSR duly selected and appointed by the Executive Council of Jamia Hamdard as per UGC Regulations.
- As resolved by the Committee and approved by the competent authority of the Jamia Hamdard, you are, once again, directed to make available the admission records of all MBBS students of Batch 2024 who were admitted against deemed to be University quota counselling through MCC in HIMSR as sought by the University without fail. These records are vital for the Committee to consider the cases of MBBS 2024 batch students for regularization purpose and holding of university examinations.
- 10. In the event, if you are not producing the admission records within three working days. (latest by Wednesday i.e. 1st October, 2025), the University shall be constrained to take legal action including filing criminal complaint against you or any of the other officials or staff or private individuals who is illegally withholding the official records of the University as per law.

Dear Sir/Madam,

With reference to the captioned matter, it is informed that:

- a) That National Medical Commission (NMC) through its communication F. No. Renewal/UGMEB/2023-24/328 dated 23.07.2025 after taking into cognizance of the large-scale statutory violations in admission, examinations, illegal bank accounts by third parties and unauthorized persons at HIMSR, in the broader interest of the academic and career prospects of the students has decided that no renewal be granted to HIMSR for 150 MBBS seats for the academic year 2025-26.
- b) That the NMC in its second communication Renewal/UGMEB/2023-24/328 dated 24.07.2025 addressed to the Registrar, Jamia Hamdard also clarified to the Jamia Hamdard that this decision will not affect the students who are already enrolled at HIMSR and their admission remain valid and must be duly regularized by the Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University).
- c) That the Jamia Hamdard through a Notice F. No. JH/RO/HIMSR/Legal-WP/2025/ICOR/24, dated 24.07.2025 notified to all students concerned of HIMSR that the Jamia Hamdard is a Deemed to be University and is bound to comply with the directions issued by the UGC and NMC and is committed to safeguard the interests of all enrolled medical students in Jamia Hamdard. In the said Notice, it was bought out that Jamia Hamdard had also sought the cooperation of the students and teachers of HIMSR in this regard for remittance of fees only to the University operated bank A/c being operated at Jammu & Kashmir Bank, opened with the PAN number of Jamia Hamdard.

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- d) The Academic Council in its 49<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 21.08.2025. The Academic Council [under item No.49 (27)] while considering the matters related to withdrawal of 150 MBBS seats and MD/MS (49 seats) programmes for the academic session 2025-26 in HIMSR, resolved to constitute a committee to finalize the modalities for regularization of already enrolled/admitted students in HIMSR in terms of NMC communication dated 24.07.2025 and authorized the Vice Chancellor in this regard.
- e) That accordingly, a committee consisting of Registrar, Dean, HIMSR, JH, Controller of Examinations, Finance Officer (Offg) and OSD (Admn.) has been constituted by the competent authority of the University.
- 2. The Committee also gone through the following records pertaining to the admission of MBBS students' of 2024 batch of HIMSR and observed that: -

#### Admission records of students of MBBS 2024 Batch

- a) The Committee also observed that the HIMSR had provided the names of 146 students through letter dated 21.10.2024 whereas the information available on the public domain on the NMC website revealed that the total admission made in HIMSR in MBBS course in 2024 stands at 150 as per the information shared by the UGMEB public notice dated 30.05.2025 as against 146.
- b) It was noted that in total 23 students were admitted against NRI quota and some names of candidates who were admitted against NRI quota are not not appearing in the list of eligible candidates for admission against NRI Quota released by the NMC under Round 1 to 3 which needs clarification from Admission Cell of HIMSR. Hence the Committee also need clarification from the In-charge, Examination Cell of HIMSR as well as the Nodal Officer of Admission Cell, HIMSR whose name was listed in the information uploaded on the MCC website by HIMSR during 2024 MBBS MCC Admission counselling process.
- c) The Committee was of unanimous view that in the light of the directions given by the NMC all the students who took admission in HIMSR in the previous academic year 2024-25 are to be regularized by the University keeping in view of the larger interest of the students who took admission in HIMSR.
- d) The Committee felt that it is not feasible to make any recommendations for the regularization admission of MBBS students admitted by HIMSR during the year 2024 in the absence of this vital admission information/records of the students admitted by HIMSR in 2024.

#### Holding of First Professional University Examinations for 2024 Batch

e) As per the Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) guidelines issued by the UGMEB of NMC dated 1.8.2023, the first Professional University Examinations shall be held at the end of First Professional Training (in the 12<sup>th</sup> month of that Training) in the subjects of Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry). Similarly, the byelaws for MBBS of Jamia Hamdard stipulates that the First Professional examination shall be held at the end of first professional training (1+12 months) in the three subjects. Whereas the information available on the public domain reveals that admissions for MBBS in 2024 batch was extended in HIMSR until 04.11.2024.

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- The committee observed that the 12 months period at the end of Professional training is not over in August/Sept 2025 based on the admission data available on the NMC admission data as the last student was admitted on 04.11.2024. Hence there is no pressing urgency in holding the 1st Professional Examinations for three subjects with six papers from 08.09.2025 for 2024 MBBS Batch as suggested by HIMSR.
- g) HIMSR did not provide adequate admission information of all the students who were admitted in MBBS programmes during academic year 2024 to ascertain when a student took admission in the MBBS programme in HIMSR and when did he/she complete the First Professional training in the subjects.
- In order to process the cases of all admitted students of MBBS 2024 Batch, you 3. are requested to make available the following records in original for the consideration of the Committee
  - a) A complete list of all Students of MBBS 2024 Batch admitted in HIMSR in the along with all basic information (contact details of students) along with Tuition fee and other fees collected by HIMSR from the students (up-to-date) for verification purpose for regularization of admissions.
  - b) Original documents/admission records and affidavits obtained from all 23 students who were admitted against NRI quota for verification along with the list of eligible candidates for counselling under NRI quota released by MCC/NMC.
- You are requested to make available the above records and information latest by Wednesday, 10th Sept 2025 (AN) to the office of the Controller of Examinations. Your request for holding of 1st Professional Examination for 2024 will be considered only after regularization of the admissions of admitted students of HIMSR in 2024. Please note no University Examinations should be conducted by HIMSR without the written approval by the Jamia Hamdard.

Sir,

In reference to the communications dated 06.06.2025; 11.07.2025 received from your university seeking request for the withdrawal of 150 MBBS seats and 49 seats in MD/MS programmes at Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (HIMSR) for the academic year 2025-26 on the grounds of alleged irregularities and unauthorized use of the institution's name by individuals not associated with Jamia Hamdard, and not appointed as Principal/Dean of HIMSR by the competent authority, as per the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations. The aforesaid request was subsequently confirmed by your University through a formal communication withdrawing the earlier letters of consent granted to HIMSR for conducting MBBS and MD/MS programmes for the academic year 2025-26.

2. In light of the aforesaid facts and the relevant provisions of UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023, the National Medical Commission considered the matter in its Coordination Meeting held on 22.07.2025 wherein the broader interest of the academic and career prospects of the students were considered and the Commission decided that no renewal be granted to HIMSR for 150 MBBS seats for the academic year 2025–26. Please note that this decision

pertains solely to admissions for the academic year 2025-26. The matter may be reconsidered for future academic sessions, subject to the outcome of the pending court cases being filed by the Jamia Hamdard (deemed to be) University or HIMSR or any other connected parties in relation to the ongoing dispute, before Hon'ble High Court of Delhi or before any other court of law.

- 3. Furthermore, it is clarified that this decision will not affect students who are already enrolled at HIMSR. Their admissions remain valid and must be duly regularized by Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University).
- 4. This issues with the approval of Competent Authority.

#### **ORDER**

WHEREAS vide Public Notice dated 01.11.2024 issued by UGMEB on the website of NMC on 06.11.2024, directing all medical colleges with valid Letters of Permission (LoP) to upload the details/data of their respective institutions on the NMC portal for the annual declaration, as required under the NMC Act, 2019 and various regulations issued by NMC from time to time, for the grant of renewal of MBBS seats for the academic year 2025-26.

**WHEREAS** based on the details furnished by your college, the experts assessed the submissions, and accordingly, a Notice dated 11.05.2025 was issued highlighting the following deficiencies observed during the assessment:

- a. Twelve (12) out of Twenty (20) departments are deficient in faculty/Resident/tutor as per AEBAS record data.
- b. Inadequate Cytopathology Investigation.
- c. Birth/Death data does not co-relate with clinical load in the institute.
- d. Salary proof not attached in faculty declaration forms.
- e. Data not provided for Minor/Major OTs.

**WHEREAS** pursuant to above mentioned deficiencies, a compliance report were submitted by your Institution which was evaluated by the Assessors; however, amongst other deficiencies, following key deficiencies were again highlighted with respect to your College/Institution.

Cytopathology Investigation still inadequate.

**WHEREAS** it was further observed that during the renewal process for the previous academic year 2024-25, in view of the substantive nature of the deficiencies in your college, a conditional renewal was granted to your college and a penalty of of Rs. 6,00,000/- was imposed.

**WHEREAS** the Competent Authority has reviewed the Annual Declaration Report (ADR) submitted by your college/institutions and also the deficiencies pointed out by the experts. The compliance report submitted by the college has not been found to be convincing and satisfactory.

WHEREAS meanwhile the deliberations on grant of renewal were under process, the Commission received a letter no. F.No. JH/RO/HIMSR/UG-admissions/2025-26/ECOR/74 dated 06.06.2025 from the Registrar of Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be) University, citing the irregularities and misuse of institutional name by the unauthorized persons not connected to the affairs of Jamia Hamdard and persons not appointed as Principal/ Dean of the Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (HIMSR), the competent authority of the University in compliance with the UGC Institutional Deemed to be Universities Regulations as amended from time to time, In furtherance of allegations made by the Jamia Hamdard, the university vide abovementioned letter made a formal request for withdrawal of MBBS (150) seats), MD/MS 49 seats in HIMSR for the academic session 2025-26 wherein University has stated that a stage has been reached where it may not be possible for the Jamia Hamdard to offer the MBBS and MD/MS programmes for the new academic year 2025-26.

WHEREAS Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be) University, in support of the above contentions, has provided the minutes of the 70<sup>th</sup> Executive Council meeting held on 27.02.2025 wherein the Executive Council resolved to adopt the recommendations of the Academic Council's 48th meeting (emergent) of the Academic Council of Jamia Hamdard held on 24th February, 2025, wherein the competent authority has decided as under:

"The Registrar appraised the members that as per the requirements under the UGC Regulations, 2023, every deemed to be University shall make available the prospectus on its website at least sixty days before the commencement of admissions, including fee structure, refund policy, number of seats in a programme, eligibility qualifications, admission process, etc. The Registrar also informed the Members that admissions related to MBBS/MD/MS/M.Sc (Medical) programmes under HIMSR are not included in the Admission Prospectus because there was a large scale violations at the hands of the unauthorized persons acting as Offg Dean/Principal. Due to which the University Administration has decided not to recognize such illegal admissions made by HIMSR by using an illegal prospectus for HIMSR. The Registrar also appraised the Members that illegal fee collections were made by HIMSR through unrecognized UCO Bank Account opened by a third party in the name of HIMSR which has been debit freezed with the orders of RBI Ombudsman order dated 15.10.2024. Notwithstanding above illegal admissions were made in MD/MS programmes even after the debit freezing of bank account and fees were collected through demand drafts from the students in the name of HIMSR. These demand drafts were encashed through another illegal bank account with PNB AsafAli Road Branch. New Delhi which was opened on 12.11.2024.

...Members suggested that unless and until the matter is resolved properly, it is not advisable for the University to include Medical Programmes under HIMSR in the Jamia Hamdard Admission Prospectus 2025-26 to stop further violations of UGC Regulations, 2023 in medical admissions and keeping in the interest of the student. If required the NMC may be informed once again. The AC after due deliberations resolved to adopt the above suggestions by majority members."

WHEREAS on receipt of above communications from the University, the Commission sought further clarifications from Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be) University as well as from your institution regarding the withdrawal of the consent of affiliation to HIMSR. To said query, the University vide letter no. F. No. JH/RO/HIMSR/Legal-WP/2025/ECOR/92 dated 11.07.2025 has acknowledged the withdrawal of all previously issued letters of consent for offering MBBS and MD/MS programmes at HIMSR for the upcoming academic year 2025–26. The University has further clarified that the Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be) University being established under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 has no power to grant affiliation to other institutions and therefore it cannot be an affiliating university as per clause 26 of the UGC Institutions Deemed to be Universities Regulations, 2023. Consequently, HIMSR cannot be treated as an affiliated institution of Jamia Hamdard and it is a constituent of the Jamia Hamdard.

WHEREAS the Commission also received the reply from your institution on the same date. In your reply, a conflicting clarification was furnished wherein your college intimated that HIMSR has been under the academic, financial and administrative control of the sponsoring society namely HNF-Medical Relief and Education Committee registered under Registrar of Societies (RoS) and the only relationship HIMSR has with the University is with respect to the award of degrees to the students who pass the requisite examinations conducted by HIMSR.

WHEREAS a meeting was held in the National Medical Commission on 22.07.2025 wherein the communications received from the university regarding the alleged illegal activities being carried out by the HIMSR as well the request of the Jamia Hamdard intimating withdrawal of all earlier letters of consent for running MBBS and MS/MD programs at HIMSR for the academic year 2025–26, has been considered by the Commission in said meeting.

THEREFORE the National Medical Commission, after considering the communications received from the University regarding the alleged irregularities and misuse of name of its constituent institution namely HIMSR by the unauthorized persons not connected to the affairs of Jamia Hamdard and persons not appointed as Principal/ Dean of the HIMSR and further regarding the withdrawal of all earlier letters of consent for running MBBS and MS/MD programs at HIMSR for the academic year 2025–26 and pursuant to a decisions made in the NMC meeting dated 22.07.2025, the Under Graduate Medical Education Board,

has decided <u>not to grant renewal of 150 UG (MBBS) seats to HIMSR for the academic year 2025–26</u>, in order to safeguard the academic and career prospects of the students.

If the college / Institution is not satisfied and aggrieved with the decision of the Board, you may prefer an appeal before the Commission under Section 9, Chapter IV of the Maintenance of Standards of Medical Education Regulations 2023 (MSMER 2023) within Sixty (60) days of the issue of this letter.

#### **ORDER**

Subject: First Appeal filed by Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences & Research (HIMSR), New Delhi, challenging the decision dated 23.07.2025 of UGMEB.

This is with reference to the first appeal dated 31.07.2025 filed by Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences & Research (HIMSR), New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as "the Medical College") under Section 9 of MSMER 2023, challenging the decision dated 23.07.2025 of the UGMEB, whereby deficiencies were observed during the assessment of the Annual Declaration Form submitted by the Medical College for the grant of annual renewal of 150 MBBS seats for the Academic Year (AY) 2025-26. During the said assessment and renewal process, the UGMEB also acknowledged the administrative issues between the Medical College and University-Jamia Hamdard Deemed to be University, and the withdrawal of all earlier letters of consent by the University for running MBBS and MS/MD programmes at HIMSR for AY 2025-26. Consequently, vide the impugned order dated 23.07.2025. Consequently, the UGMEB decided not to grant renewal of 150 UG (MBBS) seats to HIMSR for AY 2025-26, in order to safeguard the academic and career prospects of the students.

- 2. The Medical Colleges/Institutions are obligated under Regulation 4 of the MSMER, 2023 (notified on 19.09.2023) to furnish an Annual Disclosure Report and it shall be the duty of Medical College/Institution or the concerned agency/agencies exercising control over such Medical College/Institution to furnish the information (including additional information) to the concerned Board in the prescribed mode.
- 3. Whereas the UGMEB, through its Public Notice dated 01.11.2024 (uploaded on NMC's website on 06.11.2024), directed all Medical Colleges/Institutions to fill the details/data of respective institutions on the NMC Portal for Annual Declaration as required in the NMC Act, 2019 and various Regulations issued by NMC from time to time. Further, the Medical Colleges/Institutions were intimated that the submission of the duly completed Annual Declaration Form of each College on the NMC Portal is mandatory for annual renewal of permission of UG-MBBS seats, failing which no seat shall be permitted in case of annual declaration not submitted within the specified time

period. Furthermore, the Medical Colleges/Institutions were also informed about the incorporation of certain mandatory additional information in the Annual Declaration Portal for the AY 2025-26. Subsequently, vide Public Notice dated 24.04.2025, it was also directed to furnish the additional information relating to the number of Minor and Major OTs and the details of cadavers.

- 4. Whereas the details were submitted by the Medical College for assessment of the Annual Declaration Form and grant of Renewal of 150 Undergraduate Seats (MBBS) for the year 2025-26. The details submitted by the Medical College were assessed by the experts evaluating the Annual Declaration Form as per UG-MSR-2023 and MSMER-2023, video recording of examination and AEBAS Report of faculty attendance of last one year, and several deficiencies were observed.
- 5. Accordingly, a Show Cause Notice dated 11.05.2025 was issued to the Medical College, outlining the observed deficiencies and directing the Medical College to submit the written clarification on each deficiency observed by the experts, within seven days. The identified deficiencies are detailed below:
  - (i) Twelve (12) out of Twenty (20) departments are deficient in faculty/Resident/tutor as per AEBAS record data. Anatomy, Anesthesiology, Biochemistry, Dentistry, Dermatology, Forensic Medicine & Toxicology, General Surgery, Microbiology, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Oto-Rhinolarygology, Physiology, Psychiatry.

(ii) Inadequate Cytopathology Investigation.

(iii) Birth/Death data does not corelate with clinical load in the institute.

(iv) Salary proof not attached in faculty declaration forms.

- (v) Data not provided for Minor/Major OTs.
- 6. Subsequently, the compliance report submitted by the Medical College was evaluated by the Assessors; however, the compliance report was not found to be convincing and satisfactory, and amongst other deficiencies, the following key deficiencies were again highlighted:
  - (i) Cytopathology investigations are still inadequate.
- 7. Further, it was also observed that during the renewal process for the previous academic year 2024-25, in view of the substantive nature of the deficiencies in the Medical College, a conditional renewal was granted to the Medical College and a penalty of Rs. 6,00,000/- was imposed.
- 8. Meanwhile, while the deliberations on the grant of renewal were in process, the Commission received Letter No. F. No. JH/RO/HIMSR/UG-admissions/2025-26/ECOR/74 dated 06.06.2025 from the Registrar of Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University), citing irregularities and misuse of the institutional name by unauthorized persons at HIMSR. Through the aforesaid

letter, the University made a formal request for withdrawal of 150 MBBS seats and 49 MD/MS seats in HIMSR for the Academic Session 2025-26, stating that a stage had been reached where it may not be possible for Jamia Hamdard to offer the MBBS and MD/MS programmes for the new academic year 2025-26.

- 9. In support of the above contentions, the Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be) University provided the minutes of the 70th Executive Council meeting held on 27.02.2025 wherein the Executive Council resolved to adopt the recommendations of the Academic Council's 48th meeting (emergent) of the Academic Council of Jamia Hamdard held on 24.02.2025, wherein the competent authority has inter alia decided that "unless and until the matter is resolved properly, it is not advisable for the University to include Medical Programmes under HIMSR in the Jamia Hamdard Admission Prospectus 2025-26 to stop further violations of UGC Regulations, 2023 in medical admissions and keeping in the interest of the student. If required, the NMC may be informed once again. The AC, after due deliberations, resolved to adopt the above suggestions by majority members."
- 10. Upon receipt of the aforesaid communications, the Commission sought clarifications from Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) and from the institution regarding the withdrawal of consent of affiliation to HIMSR. In response, the University, vide Letter No. F.No. JH/RO/HIMSR/Legal-WP/2025/ECOR/92 dated 11.07.2025, confirmed withdrawal of all previously issued letters of consent for MBBS and MD/MS programmes at HIMSR for AY 2025–26, and clarified that being a Deemed University under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, it has no power to grant affiliation as per Clause 26 of the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023. Accordingly, HIMSR cannot be treated as an affiliated institution, and it is a constituent of the Jamia Hamdard.
- 11. The Commission also received a reply from your institution on the same date, wherein a conflicting clarification was furnished stating that HIMSR is under the academic, financial and administrative control of the sponsoring society, namely HNF-Medical Relief and Education Committee registered under the Registrar of Societies (RoS), and that its only relationship with the University is for the award of degrees to students who pass the examinations conducted by HIMSR.
- 12. In this connection, a meeting was held in the National Medical Commission on 22.07.2025, wherein the communications received from the University regarding the alleged illegal activities being carried out by HIMSR, as well as the request of Jamia Hamdard withdrawing all earlier letters of consent for running MBBS and MS/MD programmes at HIMSR for the Academic Year 2025-26, were considered by the Commission.
- 13. The UGMEB, vide order dated 23.07.2025 (impugned order), after considering the communications received from the University regarding the alleged irregularities and misuse of the name of its constituent institution, HIMSR, by unauthorized persons not connected with the affairs of Jamia Hamdard and not appointed as Principal/Dean of HIMSR, and further noting

the withdrawal of all earlier letters of consent for running MBBS and MS/MD programmes at HIMSR for AY 2025-26, and pursuant to the decisions taken in the NMC meeting held on 22.07.2025, decided not to grant renewal of 150 UG (MBBS) seats to HIMSR for AY 2025-26, in order to safeguard the academic and career prospects of the students.

- 14. Being aggrieved by the aforesaid impugned order dated 23.07.2025, the Medical College has filed the instant 1<sup>st</sup> Appeal dated 31.07.2025 under Section 9 of MSMER, 2023, praying for renewal of 150 UG (MBBS) seats to the Medical College for the academic session 2025-26. The Appellant Medical College has inter alia submitted the following submissions for consideration in its Appeal:
  - (i) The number of Cytopathology investigations is adequate as per NMC guidelines 2023.
  - (ii) The total number of cytopathology examinations for the period 01.11.2023 to 31.10.2023 is 4021, which is well over and above the requisite numbers.
- 15. In this regard, the instant 1st Appeal has been admitted, and the Appeal Committee, constituted under the Chairmanship of Dr. Abhijat Chandrakant Sheth, Chairman, NMC and two Members (Nominated), met on 29.08.2025 to consider the said Appeal filed by the Medical College. The following Appeal Committee members were present during the meeting:
  - a. Dr. Abhijat Chandrakant Sheth, Chairman, NMC- Chairman
  - b. Dr. D. K. Sharma, Medical Superintendent, Dr. Rajender Prasad Centre for Ophthalmic Sciences, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Delhi - Member (Nominated)
  - c. Prof. (Dr.) Gangadhar Taduri, Department of Nephrology, Nizam Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS), Hyderabad, Telangana- **Member (Nominated)**
  - d. Dr. Raghav Langer, Secretary, NMC- Convener of Appeal Committee.

Hearing of the 1st Appeal and observations of the Appeal Committee:

16. The Appeal Committee granted a virtual hearing to the Medical College-HIMSR and the Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) on 29.08.2025, represented by their respective Dean/Principal/Vice-Principal/HoD/Registrar, and heard their submissions. The Committee noted that the Medical College had submitted details for assessment of the Annual Declaration Form seeking annual renewal of 150 MBBS seats for AY 2025–26. These details were assessed by experts evaluating the Annual Declaration Form as per UG-MSR-2023 and MSMER-2023, video recording of examination and AEBAS Report of faculty attendance of the last one year, and various deficiencies were observed against the prescribed minimum standards. Accordingly, a Show Cause Notice dated 11.05.2025 was issued, and even after considering the compliance report, the deficiency of inadequate Cytopathology investigations persisted. The UGMEB further acknowledged communications from the University regarding alleged irregularities and misuse of HIMSR's name by unauthorized persons

not connected with Jamia Hamdard, along with the withdrawal of all earlier letters of consent for running MBBS and MS/MD programmes for AY 2025-26. Consequently, UGMEB decided not to grant renewal of 150 MBBS seats to HIMSR for AY 2025-26, in order to safeguard the academic and career prospects of the students.

- 17. During the hearing, Jamia Hamdard University submitted that HIMSR is not a separate institution but a constituent unit of Jamia Hamdard, a deemed-to-be University, and therefore only the University is competent to represent and administer it. It was further contended that no third-party society or suspended employees can claim authority over the institution, and that mere disbursement of salaries does not confer statutory recognition. The University also urged that, in view of the pending court proceedings, no approval should be granted at this stage so as to prevent irreparable harm to the interests of the students. The Appellant Medical College-HIMSR submitted that it is fully compliant with the prescribed minimum requirements and that the deficiencies observed have already been addressed.
- 18. Upon careful consideration of the records and the submissions made by the Medical College and the University, the Committee observed that the administrative controversy between them is presently pending adjudication in arbitration proceedings as well as before the Hon'ble Delhi High Court. Furthermore, the University, while alleging various irregularities in the functioning of the Medical College, has withdrawn all earlier letters of consent for running MBBS and MS/MD programmes for AY 2025-26. In consequence of this withdrawal, the Medical College has failed to comply with the fundamental and mandatory requirements under the prevailing NMC Regulations, which are essential for the grant of annual renewal and for the lawful conduct of a Medical College.
- Furthermore, the Committee observed that Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University), through its communications dated 06.06.2025 and 11.07.2025, had requested the withdrawal of 150 MBBS seats and 49 MD/MS seats for the academic year 2025-26 at Hamdard Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (HIMSR). In view of the same, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the UGC (Institutions Deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023, and considering the broader academic and career interests of students, the National Medical Commission, in its Coordination Meeting held on 22.07.2025, decided not to grant renewal for 150 MBBS seats for AY 2025-26. It was further noted that this decision pertains solely to admissions for the academic year 2025-26 and may be reviewed in subsequent academic sessions, subject to the outcome of the pending litigation relating to the ongoing dispute between the parties. It was also clarified that the decision does not affect students already admitted at HIMSR, whose admissions remain valid and are to be duly regularized by Jamia Hamdard. The Commission communicated the aforesaid decision to the Registrar, Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University), vide letter dated 24.07.2025.

20. The Appeal Committee also noted that multiple litigations filed by Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) and HIMSR are currently pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and other quasi-judicial bodies, such as the Arbitral Tribunal. In view of the same, the Committee observed that the Commission is not the competent authority to adjudicate the internal disputes between the University and the Medical College-HIMSR.

Decision of the Appeal Committee:

- 21. The Appeal Committee has duly considered the 1<sup>st</sup> Appeal filed by the Medical College, along with the submissions made during the hearing held on 29.08.2025. However, the Committee found the submissions of the Medical College to be unconvincing and unsatisfactory. Taking into account the observations made hereinabove, the Appeal Committee concludes that since the University has withdrawn the consent letters for running MBBS and MS/MD programmes for AY 2025-26, the Medical College has consequently failed to comply with the fundamental and mandatory requirements under the prevailing NMC Regulations for the conduct and renewal of medical courses. In view of the above, the Committee finds no infirmity in the order of the UGMEB dated 23.07.2025. Accordingly, the 1<sup>st</sup> Appeal filed by the Medical College is rejected, and the decision of the UGMEB dated 23.07.2025 declining renewal of 150 MBBS seats to HIMSR for AY 2025-26 is hereby upheld.
- 22. Further, it is clarified that the decision not to grant renewal of 150 MBBS seats to HIMSR for the academic year 2025-26 shall not affect students already admitted in previous academic sessions. Their admissions remain valid and must be duly regularized by Jamia Hamdard (Deemed to be University) in accordance with the applicable regulations. The University is accordingly directed to take all necessary steps to ensure the academic continuity of these students and to maintain regulatory compliances under the relevant provisions of the UGC and NMC Regulations.
- 23. Accordingly, the 1st Appeal filed by the Medical College stands disposed of.
- 24. If the Appellant/Medical College is aggrieved by the decision of the Commission, a second appeal may be filed, under Regulation 10 of the MSMER, 2023, before the Central Government within 30 days from the date of this order if the Medical College so desires.

#### विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिसूचना

नई दिल्ली, 2 जून, 2023

सं. एफ. 1-1/2021 (सीपीपी-1/डीयू).—विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग अधिनियम, 1956 की धारा 26 के खंड (च) और खंड (छ) तथा धारा 12 (क) की उपधारा (2) और उपधारा (4) द्वारा प्रदत्त शक्तियों का प्रयोग करते हुए और विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (समिविश्वविद्यालय संस्था) विनियम, 2019 को, उन बातों के सिवाय अधिक्रांत करते हुए, जिन्हें ऐसे अधिक्रमण से पहले किया गया है या करने का लोप किया गया है। विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग, केंद्रीय सरकार के पूर्व अनुमोदन से एक व्यवस्थित तरीके से विनियमित करने के लिए समिविश्वविद्यालय संस्थाओं के रूप में अकादिमक उत्कृष्टता के संस्थानों की घोषणा की प्रक्रिया और समिविश्वविद्यालय की अवधारणा के आदर्शों के अनुरूप ऐसे विश्वविद्यालयों द्वारा प्रदान की जाने वाली उच्च शिक्षा की गुणवत्ता को बनाए रखने के लिए निम्नलिखित नियम बनाता है, अर्थात्: —

- 1. संक्षिप्त नाम,लागू होना और प्रारंभः-
  - (1) इन विनियमों का संक्षिप्त नाम विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (समविश्वविद्यालय संस्थान) विनियम, 2023 है।

- (33) विधिक कार्यवाहियां (1) रिजस्ट्रार समविश्वविद्यालय संस्था के विरूद्ध किन्ही विधिक कार्यवाहियों के प्रयोजन के लिए वाद दायर कर सकेगा, जिसके पास सम विश्वविद्यालय संस्था की और से करार करने, दस्तावेजों पर हस्ताक्षर करने और अभिलेखों को प्रमाणित करने की शक्ति होगी इन विनियमों के उपबंधों के प्रधीन ऐसी शक्तियों का प्रयोग करने तथा ऐसे कर्तव्यों का पालन करने की शक्तिया होगीं।
  - (2) इनमें से किसी विनियम के अनुसरण में सरकार या आयोग इन विनियमों के उपबंधों के अधीन विनियम के अनुसरण में की गई कोई बात या तात्पर्यित या आशयित के बाबत आयोग के विरुद्ध कोई दावा की गई कोई बात या तात्पर्यित या तात्पर्यित या आशयित के बाबत या विधिक कार्यवाही नहीं होगी।

#### (34) विनियमों के उल्लंघन के परिणाम

जहां एक सम विश्वविद्यालय संस्था को इन विनियमों या आयोग के किसी अन्य लागू विनियमों के उपबंधों का उल्लंघन करते हुए पाया जाता है, तो यह निम्नलिखित कारवाईयों में से एक या अधिक के अधीन हो सकेगा।

- (क) आयोग या सरकार द्वारा गठित जांच समिति द्वारा स्थापित इन विनियमों के उल्लंघन के लिए, सम विश्वविद्यालय संस्था को सार्वजनिक सूचना के साथ लिखित में चेतावनी दी जाएगी या नए पाठ्यक्रमों/अध्ययन कार्यक्रमों/विभागों और ऑफ कैम्पसों/शोर कैम्पसों के स्थापना के जैसी से विविधीकरण के संर्दभ में किसी भी विस्तार से तीन वर्ष की अविध के लिए या जैसा जांच समिति द्वारा सिफारिश की जाए जो भी उच्चत्तर हो तक वर्जित रखा जाएगा।
- (ख) आयोग या सरकार द्वारा गठित जांच समिति द्वारा स्थापित विनियमों का निरंतर उल्लघंन पाठ्यक्रमों या अध्ययन कार्यक्रमों या विभागों या ऑफ कैम्पसों या संघटक संस्थाओं या ऑफ शोर कैम्पसों के बंद होने का परिणाम होगा और सम विश्वविद्यालय संस्था की प्रास्थिति वापस होने का परिणाम होगा।

### UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 2nd June, 2023

- No. F. 1-1/2021 (CPP-I/DU).—In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (f) and (g) of section 26 and sub-sections (2) and (4) of section 12A of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and in supersession of the UGC [Institutions Deemed to be Universities] Regulations, 2019, except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the University Grants Commission, with the previous approval of the Central Government hereby makes the following regulations to regulate in an orderly manner, the process of declaration of institutions of academic excellence as institutions deemed to be Universities and to maintain the quality of higher education imparted by such Universities consistent with the ideals of the concept of a University, namely:—
- 1. Short-title, application and commencement.— (1) These regulations may be called the University Grants Commission (Institutions deemed to be Universities) Regulations, 2023.
- (2) These regulations shall apply to any institution seeking declaration as an institution deemed to be University and to any institution for higher education declared under section 3 of the said Act, to be an institution deemed to be University for the purposes of the University Grants Commission Act:

Provided that the institutions already declared as deemed to be Universities under section 3 shall achieve the eligibility criteria mentioned in sub-regulation (1) of regulation 4 within ten years from the date of commencement of these regulations.

Provided further that the Commission shall take appropriate measures on such institutions which fail to meet the eligibility criteria specified in sub-regulation (1) of regulation 4 of these regulations.

(3) These regulations shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette:

- (2) The term of the Head of the department or chairperson of the centre shall normally be two years and he or she shall be eligible for re-appointment for one more term by following the procedure prescribed for appointment of the Head of the department or chairperson of the centre.
- (3) The powers and functions of the Head of the department or chairperson of the centre shall be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.

#### 24. Admission and fees structure.—

- **A.** Admission.—Admission of students to the institution deemed to be University, public or self-financing, shall be strictly based on merit in the entrance exam conducted by a Government Testing Agency or the institution deemed to be University and as prescribed by the appropriate statutory authority, wherever applicable and in case of no entrance examination, the admission of students to the institution deemed to be University may be made in the manner specified in the prospectus.
- **B.** Fee structure.— (1) Donation or capitation fee in whatever nomenclature or form, either directly or indirectly, isstrictly prohibited.
- (2) The institutions deemed to be Universities shall follow the rules and regulations regarding fee structure, number of seats, etc., issued by the relevant statutory bodies and in case an institution deemed to be University offers different courses which come under the regulatory ambit of different statutory bodies, namely the University Grants Commission, the All India Council of Technical Education, National Medical Council etc., the rules and regulations regarding fee structure, number of seats, etc., issued by such statutory body concerned shall be applicable.
  - (3) The fee shall be fixed transparently, keeping in view non-profiteering or non-commercial aspects.
- (4) The fee shall be collected as declared in the prospectus of the institution deemed to be University and with a proper receipt for such payment and the prospectus shall also state that donation or capitation fee in whatever nomenclature or form, either directly or indirectly, shall not be collected from the student or parent and in case of any grievance, the student or parent may submit their complaint to the institution deemed to be University.
- (5) The institution deemed to be University may provide fee concession or scholarships or may allocate some seats to meritorious students belonging to socially and economically deprived groups of the society.
- (6) The institution deemed to be University shall abide by all the University Grant Commission notifications, guidelines regarding the refund of fees and return of original certificates, as may be issued from time to time.
- (7) Every institution deemed to be University shall maintain the records of the entire process of selection of candidates, exhibit such records on its website, and preserve such records for a minimum period of five years.
- (8) The institution deemed to be University shall make available the prospectus on its website at least sixty days before the commencement of admissions, including fee structure, refund policy, number of seats in a programme, eligibility qualifications, admission process, etc.
- (9) The institution deemed to be University shall not retain any original certificates of the students, faculty members, and staff.
- 25. Institution deemed to be University open to all.—(1) The institution deemed to be University shall be open to the persons of all genders and of whatevercaste, creed, race or class, and it shall not be lawful for the institution deemed to be University to adopt or impose on any person, any test whatsoever of religious belief or profession in order to entitle him or her to be appointed as a faculty member of the institution deemed to be University or to hold any other office therein or to be admitted as a student in the institution deemed to be University or to graduate there at or to enjoy or exercise any privilege thereof:

Provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to prevent the institution deemed to be University from making special provision for the employment or admission of women, persons with disabilities, or of persons belonging to the weaker section of the society and, in particular, of the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the other socially and educationally backward classes of citizens.

- (2) All policies and procedures, in matters of admission, fee, and employment as applicable to the university level public funded and self-financing institutions, respectively, shall apply.
- **26.** Institution deemed to be University to be unitary.— The institution deemed to be University shall be unitary in nature and shall not affiliate any other institution.

- 27. Reservation policy.— Institution deemed to be University shall implement the policy on reservations in admissions and recruitment, in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of India and any Act of Parliament for the time being in force and disclose all such information on its website.
- **28.** Online or distance education.— Institutions deemed to be Universities may offer courses online or distance courses or degrees in accordance with the regulations notified by the Commission from time to time.
- 29. Power to conduct enquiry and consequences for violation of regulations.— (1) Where the Government or the Commission, as the case may be, receives information by way of a complaint or otherwise, that an institution deemed to be University has violated any of the provisions of these regulations, it shall cause to conduct an enquiry into the facts of such information after issuing a notice to the said effect to the institution deemed to be University.
- (2) The Commission may also cause an inspection, to be made by experts in matters of academics, administration, and finance regarding academic outcomes or any matter connected with the administration or finances of the institution deemed to be University for the purpose of the enquiry.
- (3) Based on the enquiry or through procedures mentioned in these regulations, if the Government or the Commission, as the case may be, is satisfied that the regulations have been violated, the institution deemed to be University shall be subjected to such action as provided in these regulations.
- **30.** Consideration of proposals under previous regulations.—All the applications for the declaration of an institution as an institution deemed to be a University, or for the approval for establishing off-campus centres or off-shore campuses, that have been received by the Government or are pending or under process in the Commission prior to the date of publication of these regulations, as the case may be, shall be processed under the provisions of these regulations:

Provided that the applicant may submit an undertaking in writing that such an application may be processed in terms of the regulations of the Commission governing an institution deemed to be University as were in force on the date of such application, and that, subject to the approval of the application under those regulations, the applicant shall comply with the provisions of these regulations within a period of six years from the date of approval, as the case may be, failing which the status of the applicant as an institution deemed to be University or status of the off-campus or off-shore campus shall be withdrawn.

- 31. Funds, Accounts, Audit, and Annual Report.— (1) The books of accounts of the institution deemed to be University shall be maintained, managed, and operated in the name of the institution deemed to be University and not in the name of the sponsoring body or any other body; and, shall be kept in such form as may be specified by the Executive Council and conform to the rules or regulations, if any, prescribed by the Commission, in this regard.
- (2) Funds shall not be diverted at any time from the accounts of the institution deemed to be University to any other accounts, including to the accounts of the sponsoring body or to any otherbody.
- (3) The institution deemed to be University shall get its books of accounts audited annually, separately published and uploaded on the website of the institution; and if such institution is funded by Central or State Government or through its Agencies fully or partially, then the accounts of such institution deemed to be University shall be open for examination by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India and the accounts of institution deemed to be University shall also, where required, be open for inspection by the Commission.
- (4) The annual financial statements and accounts shall be audited by a qualified professional, a Member or Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, to be appointed by the institution deemed to be University:

Provided that, the Commission may, on receipt of information regarding financial impropriety or embezzlement or illegal diversion of funds from the accounts of the institution deemed to be University; or of fees being collected against the provisions of these regulations, issue a notice directing the institution deemed to be University to show cause as to why an inspection, including a forensic audit, not be ordered in respect of the complaint, and after providing a reasonable opportunity to the respondent institution, the Commission may on being satisfied that there were sufficient grounds to proceed further, cause an inspection by a team of the Commission or may direct a forensic audit; the report of and the inspection team and the forensic audit report taken together shall form the basis for the Commission to take further action, as it may be deem fit, under these regulations including the recommendation for withdrawal of institution deemed to be University status, to the Government.

- (5) Annual Reports, Annual Financial Statements, and Audit Reports shall be uploaded on the institution deemed to be University website and also on the Commission's portal, after due approval by the Executive Council and the institution deemed to be Universities managed or controlled or funded by the Central or State Government shall submit a copy of the annual report, Annual Financial Statements and annual audit report to the respective Government.
- 32. Miscellaneous.— (1) The institution deemed to be University shall, as soon as may be, after the completion of the academic programme, and in no case later than one hundred and eighty days from the date of such completion, ensure

that the degree, diploma, certificate, or any other qualification in respect of the programme of studies, is awarded and made available to students.

- (2) The institutions deemed to be Universities shall compulsorily create Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), identities of their students and upload their credit scores in digital lockers and ensure that the credit scores are reflected in ABC portal and adopt Samarth e-Gov.
- (3) No institution deemed to be University shall at any time enter into any franchise agreement or arrangement, either overtly or covertly, with any individual or organisation for establishing, maintaining, or operating the off-campus or off-shore campus or constituent units or course or programme of study or department or school or faculty of the institution deemed to be University except in the following cases, namely:—
  - (a) the institution deemed to be University, which is eligible under sub-regulations (1) and (2) of regulation 8 may enter into an agreement or arrangement, if—
    - (i) the establishment, maintenance, or operation of such institution is permitted under any Act of Parliament or the rules or regulations made there under; and
    - (ii) it has made an application under sub-regulation (3) of regulation 8, after following the procedure specified in these regulations
  - (b) the campus to be established under such agreement or arrangement shall be-
    - (i) treated as an off-campus centre of the institution deemed to be University as long as such agreement or arrangement remains valid under such law; and
    - (ii) subject to similar standards of audit and disclosure as a not-for-profit entity as that of the institution deemed to be University;
  - (c) the institution deemed to be University, which is eligible under regulation 8 may enter into an agreement or arrangement for practical training of students of a skill-oriented vocational courses, if such course is approved by the University Grants Commission or any other body established under any Act of Parliament.
  - (d) twinning Programmes, Joint Degree Programmes, and Dual Degree Programmes shall be offered in accordance with the provisions stipulated in the University Grants Commission (Academic Collaboration between Indian and Foreign Higher Educational Institutions to offer Twinning, Joint Degree, and Dual Degree Programmes) Regulations, 2022.
  - (e) the income and property of the institution deemed to be University shall be utilised solely for promoting the objectives of the institution deemed to be University.
  - (f) the Commission shall have the power to issue directions to an institution deemed to be University for implementation of any public policy of the Government or in respect of any law in force, including appropriate directions in case of any violation of any law or policy by the institution deemed to be University.
  - (g) no portion of the income and property of the institution deemed to be University shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus, or otherwise how so ever by way of profit to the persons who were at any time or are members of the institution deemed to be University or to any of them or any persons claiming through them:
    - Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith of remuneration to any member thereof or another person as consideration for any service rendered to the institution deemed to be University or for traveling or other allowances and such other charges.
  - (h) in consultation with the Commission, the Government shall have the power to impose such other conditions, not inconsistent with these regulations, in the notification, and the same shall be binding on the institution deemed to be University.
  - (i) where an institution deemed to be University wishes to surrender its status of "institution deemed to be University", it may do so with the prior permission of the Government; and similarly, withdrawal of any constituent units or off-campus or off-shore campus of the institution deemed to be University from the purview of an institution deemed to be University, shall require the sponsoring body to take the prior permission of the Government:
    - Provided that such surrender or withdrawal, as the case may be, shall take effect only after the last batch of students on the rolls of the institution deemed to be University or its constituent units, as the case may be, have been accorded the opportunity to qualify for the completion of the programme of study and award of degree.

- (j) the institution deemed to be University shall furnish to the Central Government or the Commission such returns or other information with respect to its property or activities as the Central Government or the Commission may, from time to time, require, within such period as may be specified by the Central Government or Commission.
- (k) convocations of the institution deemed to be University for conferring the degrees or for other purposes shall be held in such manner as may be prescribed by the rules of the institution deemed to be University.
- (l) the Executive Council may, by a resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting, withdraw a degree of academic distinction conferred on, or any certificate or diploma granted to, any person by the institution deemed to be University for good and sufficient cause:
  - Provided that no such resolution shall be passed until a notice in writing has been given to that person calling upon him or her to show cause within such time as may be specified in the notice as to why such a resolution shall not be passed and until his or her objections, if any, and any evidence he or she may produce in support of them, have been considered by the Executive Council.
- (m) in the event of conflict of opinion with regard to the interpretation of these regulations, the opinion of the Commission shall be final.
- (n) with regard to institutions deemed to be Universities, the provisions contained in these regulations shall prevail in case of any inconsistency or conflicting provisions in any other regulations issued by the Commission under the provisions of the Act.
- 33. Legal proceedings.— (1) The Registrar may sue or be sued for the purpose of any legal proceedings against institution deemed to be University, who shall have the power to enter into agreements, sign documents and authenticate records on behalf of the institution deemed to be University, and have the powers to exercise such powers and perform such duties under the provisions of these regulations.
- (2) No suit or legal proceedings shall lie against the Government or the Commission in respect of any thing done or purported or intended to be done in pursuance of any of these regulations.
- 34. Consequences of the violations of regulations.— Where an institution deemed to be University is found to have violated the provisions of these regulations or any other applicable regulations of the Commission, it may be subjected to one or more of the following actions, namely:—
  - (a) for violation of these regulations established by the enquiry committee set up by the Commission or Government, the institution deemed to be University shall be warned in writing with public notice or barred from any expansion in terms of diversification to new courses or programmes of study or departments and establishment of off-campuses or off-shore campuses, for a period of three years or as recommended by the enquiry committee, whichever is higher;
  - (b) continuous violation of regulations established by the enquiry committee set up by the Commission or the Government may result in closure of the courses or programmes of study or Departments and off-campuses or constituent institutions or off-shore campuses or may result in withdrawal of the status of institution deemed to be Universit;
  - (c) in order to protect the interests of students in case of surrender or withdrawal of the status, as the case may be, shall take effect only after the last batch of students on the rolls of the institution deemed to be University or its constituent units, has been accorded opportunity to qualify for the completion of the programme of study and award of degree.
